FOR AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 3074 AND 3077, OF CODE OF 1873.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa,* That section number 3074, of the Code of 1873, be and the same is hereby amended by adding to said section the following: "Except as against an execution issued on a judgment rendered for clothing or provisions furnished to the debtor or his family." And section number 3077 is amended by adding to said section the following: "And none of said exemptions shall be allowed against an execution issued on a judgment rendered for the wages of a laboring man, except the clothing, beds, bedding, and household and kitchen furniture, as provided in section number 3072."

FOR AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 3077, OF CODE OF 1873.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa,* That section 3077,
2 of the Code, be amended by adding thereto the following, to-wit: “And none of said ex-
3 emptions shall be allowed against an execution issued on a judgment rendered for the wages
4 of a laboring man or a mechanic.”
