SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE FILES NOS. 124, 131 AND 170.

A BILL

FOR AN ACT TO REPEAL SECTION 12, CHAPTER 2, TITLE I, OF THE CODE, IN RELATION TO COMPENSATION AND MILEAGE OF MEMBERS OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, AND COMPENSATION OF OFFICERS AND EMPLOYES OF THE SAME; AND TO ENACT A SUBSTITUTE THEREFOR.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa,* That all of section 2 12, chapter 2, title I, of the Code, be and the same is hereby repealed, and the following en-
3 acted in lieu thereof:

SEC. 2. The compensation of the members, officers and employes of the general assem-
2 bly shall be: To every member for each regular session five hundred dollars, and for each
3 extra session the same compensation per day while in session, to be ascertained by the rate
4 per day of the compensation of the members of the general assembly at the preceding reg-
5 ular session; and for every mile by the nearest traveled route in going to and returning from
6 the place where the general assembly is held, five cents per mile; but in no case shall the
7 compensation for any extra session exceed six dollars per day, exclusive of mileage.

8 To the secretary of the senate and chief clerk of the house, six dollars per day each.

9 To the assistant secretaries of the senate and clerks of the house, five dollars per day each.

10 To the enrolling and engrossing clerks, four dollars per day each.

11 To the clerks of committees, two dollars and fifty cents per day each; and the necessary
12 stationary for each of the clerks, secretaries, and their assistants aforesaid.

13 To the sergeant-at-arms, door-keepers, janitors, postmasters, and mail carriers, three dol-
14 lars per day each.

15 To the messengers and paper folders, one dollar and fifty cents per day each.

16 And no other or greater compensation shall be allowed such members, officers and em-
17 ployes; nor shall there be any allowance of or for stationary, except as above provided, post-
18 age, newspapers, or other perquisites, in any form or manner, or under any name or desig-
19 nation.
