## A BILL

FOR AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 24 OF THE ACTS OF THE SIXTEENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa*, That chapter 24 of  
2 the acts of the sixteenth general assembly be and the same is hereby amended by striking  
3 out all after the words "section 463," in the fourth line of said act, and inserting in lieu  
4 thereof the following, viz.: "They shall have power to regulate, license or prohibit the sale  
5 of horses and other domestic animals at auction in the streets, alleys or public places; to  
6 regulate, license or tax all carts, wagons, drays, coaches, hacks, omnibuses, and every  
7 description of conveyance kept for hire; to regulate, tax and license taverns, restaurants and  
8 eating-houses; to prohibit or regulate, tax and license billiard saloons and billiard tables,  
9 pool tables and all other tables kept for hire, ten pin and other ball alleys, and shooting  
10 galleries or places; to regulate and license pawnbrokers and pedlars; to regulate, license or  
11 prohibit circuses, menageries, theaters, shows and exhibitions of all kinds, except such as  
12 may be exempted by the laws of the state; they shall have power to regulate, tax and license  
13 or to prohibit wine and beer saloons, and the sale of wine and beer, or other intoxicating  
14 liquors not prohibited by the laws of the state, and on the presentation of a petition to that

15 effect, signed by a majority of the permanent citizens of the incorporation who have attained  
16 the age of twenty-one years, and resided in said corporation for at least sixty days, they must  
17 prohibit wine and beer saloons and the sale of wine and beer and other intoxicating liquors  
18 not prohibited by the laws of this state, and when so prohibited, such prohibition shall extend  
19 two miles from the corporate limits of such city or town as now provided by law.

SEC. 2. This act being deemed of immediate importance, shall take effect and be in force  
2 from and after its publication in the *Iowa State Register* and *State Prohibitionist*, newspapers  
3 published at Des Moines, Iowa.

## A BILL

FOR AN ACT TO REPEAL CHAPTER TWENTY-FOUR (24) OF THE ACTS OF THE SIXTEENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA, AND ENACT A SUBSTITUTE THEREFOR.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa,* That chapter twenty-four (24) of the acts of the sixteenth general assembly be and the same is hereby repealed, and the following words, viz.:

Sec. 463. They shall have power to regulate, license or prohibit the sale of horses or other domestic animals at auction in the streets, alleys or public places; to regulate, license and tax all carts, wagons, drays, coaches, hacks, omnibuses, and every description of conveyance kept for hire; to regulate, tax, license taverns, restaurants, eating houses; to regulate, license or tax or prohibit billiard saloons, or billiard tables, pool tables and all other tables kept for hire, ten pin or other ball alleys, shooting galleries or places; to regulate or license pawnbrokers or peddlars; to regulate, license or prohibit circuses, menageries, theaters, shows and exhibitions of all kinds except such as may be exempted by the laws of the state. They shall have power to regulate, license and tax, or prohibit, wine and beer saloons, or the sale of wine and beer or other intoxicating liquors not prohibited by the laws of the state, and on the presentation of a petition to that effect, signed by a majority of the resident citizens who have attained to the age of twenty-one years, they must prohibit wine and beer saloons, or the sale of wine and beer or other intoxicating liquors not prohibited by the laws of the state, and when so prohibited, such prohibition shall extend two miles from the corporate limits of such town or city as now provided by law.

SEC. 2. This act being deemed of immediate importance by the general assembly, shall be in force from and after its publication in the *Iowa State Register* and the newspapers published in Des Moines, Iowa.
