## A BILL

FOR AN ACT TO PAY S. C. CRAWFORD FOR SERVICES AND EXPENSES IN RECRUITING ONE COMPANY OF SOLDIERS IN THE MONTHS OF OCTOBER AND NOVEMBER, A. D. 1861.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa,* That there be and is  
2 hereby appropriated out of any money in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the  
3 sum of three hundred and eighty-four and eighty one-hundredth dollars, to pay S. C. Crawford  
4 for services and expenses in recruiting one company of soldiers in the months of October  
5 and November, A. D. 1861, and the auditor is hereby directed to issue warrants on the treas-  
6 urer of state for said sum in favor of the said S. C. Crawford.

*To the Honorable Members of the Eighteenth General Assembly of the State of Iowa:*
