

A BILL

FOR AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR COMPENSATION OF COUNTY TREASURERS.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa,* That section 3793 of the Code is hereby repealed, and the following enacted in lieu thereof:

Sec. 3793. Each county treasurer shall receive for his services the following compensation:

First—Two per cent of all money collected by him as taxes due any incorporated city or town, or as taxes voted to aid in building railroads, to be paid out of the same.

Second—One-fourth of one per cent on all money paid by him into the state treasury, to be paid out of the county funds.

Third—In addition to the above, he shall receive an annual salary, to be paid out of the county treasury, of five hundred dollars, if the population of his county does not exceed five thousand. If the population exceeds five thousand he shall receive, in addition to said five hundred dollars, the sum of seventy-five dollars for each one thousand inhabitants in excess of five thousand, until the population reaches fifteen thousand. If the population exceeds fifteen thousand he shall receive, in addition to last mentioned amounts, the sum of fifty dollars for each one thousand inhabitants in excess of fifteen thousand, until the population reaches twenty thousand. If the population exceeds twenty thousand he shall receive, in addition to said amounts, the sum of twenty-five dollars for each one thousand in excess of twenty thousand, until the population reaches twenty-five thousand. When the population exceeds twenty-five thousand he shall receive, in addition to said amounts, the sum of ten dollars for each one thousand inhabitants in excess of twenty-five thousand.

The board of supervisors, at their regular session in January following the taking and publication of any census by the authority of this state, or the United States, shall determine the amount to which the treasurer of their county is entitled under the provisions of the third subdivision of this section, using such last taken and published census as a basis of computation, and shall enter the amount so determined by them upon their minute-book as a part of their proceedings.

27 All compensation for deputy or clerks necessary for the proper transaction of the business
28 shall be paid by the county.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force on and after January 1st, 1881.
