A BILL FOR

An Act to amend section eleven point eight (11.8), eleven point nine (11.9), Code 1946, relating to the compensation of state examiners and assistant state examiners and to repeal sections eleven point twenty (11.20) and eleven point twenty-one (11.21) Code 1946.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 Section 1. That section eleven point eight (11.8)
 2 Code 1946, be amended by striking from said section all
 3 of the said section after the word "auditor" in line four
 4 (4) thereof.

1 Sec. 2. That section eleven point nine (11.9) Code
 2 1946, be amended by striking all of the said section after
 3 the word "paid" in the second line thereof, and inserting
 4 in lieu thereof the following: "a sum not to exceed three
 5 thousand dollars annually, and actual and necessary expenses,
 6 including mileage. Within the maximum limit examiners and
 7 assistants shall receive such annual compensation as the
 8 auditor of state may fix."

1 Sec. 3. That section eleven point twenty (11.20)
 2 and eleven point twenty-one (11.21) Code 1946, be and they

3 are hereby repealed.

1 Sec. 4. That there is hereby annually appropriated
2 from any funds in the State Treasury, not otherwise ap-
3 propriated, a sum sufficient to defray the compensation
4 and expenses, including mileage, of such examiners and
5 such assistants. Said payments shall be made on the
6 certification of the auditor of state.

1 Sec. 5. This act being of immediate importance shall
2 be in full force and effect from and after its publication
3 in the Davis County Republican, a newspaper published at
4 Bloomfield, Iowa and in the Chariton Herald-Patriot,
5 a newspaper published at Chariton, Iowa.

EXPLANATION OF H. F. 54

This bill will put the examiners from the State Auditor's office on an annual salary basis the same as all other state employees and the costs of the audits will be paid for by the state rather than by the counties, cities and school districts as is being done at the present time.
