A BILL FOR

An act to amend section three hundred nine point sixty-six (309.66), Code 1946, relating to secondary roads, to permit sale of gravel to private parties to improve a lane, driveway, or road, and to provide method of payment therefor.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 Section 1. Section three hundred nine point sixty-six
2 (309.66), Code 1946, is amended by striking all after the word
3 "county" in line five (5) and inserting in lieu thereof the
4 following: "and may sell and deliver at cost, to private
5 parties, material from county owned gravel beds or gravel
6 purchased by the board of supervisors from beds not owned by
7 the county, in order to improve any lane, driveway, or road
8 connecting with streets and secondary roads only.

1 Sec. 2. "Before any such material can be sold to private
2 parties, any party desiring to purchase same for the aforesaid
3 purposes shall enter into a written contract with the board of
4 supervisors describing the lane, driveway, or road proposed
5 to be improved specifying the approximate number of cubic yards
6 of material required. In said contract the party purchasing
7 shall deposit in cash with the board of supervisors an amount

8 equal to one and one-fourth times the estimated cost of such
9 material delivered on the lane, driveway, or connecting road.

1 Sec. 3. "An appeal may be taken to the district court
2 from any order or decision by the board of supervisors by any
3 person affected in the same manner appeals are taken from
4 justices of the peace, except that the appeal bond shall be
5 affixed by the county auditor, in which event the county
6 auditor, after recording the original papers shall file them in
7 the office of the clerk of the district court certifying them
8 to be such, and the clerk shall docket them entitling the board
9 of supervisors as plaintiff and it shall stand for trial as
10 other cases.

1 Sec. 4. "It shall be a misdemeanor for any person to use
2 or for the board of supervisors to dispose of any such material
3 for any purpose other than for the improvement of such streets,
4 highways, lane, driveway, or connecting road."

EXPLANATION OF H. F. 114

This bill, if passed, would give the supervisors the right to sell gravel to improve a lane, driveway, or road. This is now prohibited under section three hundred nine point sixty-six (309.66), Code 1946.
