A BILL FOR

An Act to amend chapter one hundred fifty-seven (157), Code 1946, relating to cosmetology.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 Section 1. Section one hundred fifty-seven point one
2 (157.1), Code 1946, is amended by striking all of subsection
3 two (2) after the word "body" in line nine (9) and inserting
4 in lieu thereof a period (.).

1 Sec. 2. Section one hundred fifty-seven point two (157.2),
2 Code 1946, is amended by adding thereto:

3 "4. Those who are engaged exclusively in the removal of
4 superfluous hair."

1 Sec. 3. Section one hundred fifty-seven point five (157.5),
2 Code 1946, is amended by striking all of said section and
3 inserting in lieu thereof the following:

4 "Any applicant, whether he holds a cosmetology license or
5 not, desiring to practice the removal of superfluous hair by
6 the use of the electric needle shall be issued a license to do
7 so upon presenting evidence of having completed a recognized
8 course of training in such work and taking an examination
9 conducted by the board of cosmetology examiners in the use of

10 the electric needle for which the applicant shall pay a fee of
11 ten dollars. If applicant successfully passes said examination
12 he shall be issued a permit by the department which shall entitle
13 him to work at the removal of superfluous hair but does not
14 otherwise permit him to practice cosmetology.”

EXPLANATION OF H. F. 145

This bill will allow a person to engage exclusively in the practice of removing superfluous hair without having to spend some 2100 hours studying general cosmetology.
