## A BILL FOR

An Act to amend Chapter three hundred fifty-nine (359), Code 1946, providing for the depositing and disbursement of township cemetery funds or such cemetery funds jointly owned, and the execution and delivery of official deeds for cemetery lots.

*Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:*

1 Section 1. Section three hundred fifty-nine point  
2 thirty-two (359.32), Code 1946, is hereby amended by  
3 adding thereto the following:

4 "In the event of the sale of lots or portions  
5 thereof the township trustees shall make, execute  
6 and deliver the official deed of the township,  
7 evidencing such sale and conveying such lots or  
8 portions thereof to the purchaser, and shall  
9 record the same with the county recorder. The  
10 expense of making the foregoing official deed and  
11 the recording thereof shall be paid by such  
12 purchaser."

1 Sec. 2. All funds received from the sale of township  
2 cemetery lots or portions thereof shall be deposited in  
3 conformity with the terms of section four hundred fifty-three

4 point one (453.1), Code 1946. And funds received by a joint  
5 board created and existing under the provisions of section  
6 359.36, Code 1946, shall be deposited under the terms of  
7 the foregoing section 453.1 in an account which discloses  
8 that the same is the joint property of the township or  
9 city or town joined. Any cemetery funds so deposited  
10 shall be withdrawn by warrants issued by the joint board  
11 or by the authority of such body.

EXPLANATION OF H. F. 433

The purpose of this bill is to require the issuance of a deed by the township trustee for cemetery lots purchased by individuals and further provide for the depositing of these funds in the bank authorized for the depositing of township funds. This bill also requires that this cemetery deed be recorded in the county court house, the cost of such recording to be paid for by the purchaser.
