A BILL FOR

An Act to provide for the transfer of funds in the state sinking fund for public deposit, created in chapter four hundred fifty-four (454), Code, 1946, and the transfer of such funds therefrom creates a general contingent fund for the ensuing biennium and providing for the administration of said fund.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 Section 1. Notwithstanding any provision of chapter
2 four hundred fifty-four (454), Code, 1946, one million
3 dollars (\$1,000,000.00) of the balance existing June 30,
4 1947, in the state sinking fund for public deposits is
5 hereby transferred to the general contingent fund of the
6 state.

1 Sec. 2. The general contingent fund of the state for
2 the biennium beginning July 1, 1947, and ending June 30,
3 1949, is hereby created and said fund shall consist of the
4 sum of one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) transferred to
5 it from the balance referred to in section one (1) of this
6 act. Said fund shall be administered by the joint committee
7 on retrenchment and reform and allocations therefrom may
8 be made for contingencies arising during the biennium which
9 are legally payable from funds of the state. No allocations

10 from said fund shall be made for the administration of or
11 carrying out the provisions of any act passed by the 52nd
12 General Assembly which does not contain an appropriation.
13 Nor shall the committee on retrenchment and reform allocate
14 any funds for any purpose or project which was or should
15 have been presented to the General Assembly by way of a
16 bill and which failed to become enacted into law. The
17 state comptroller shall report the disposition made of
18 the fund to the 53rd General Assembly. Any balance in
19 said contingent fund as of June 30, 1949, shall revert to
20 the general fund of the state.
