A BILL FOR

An Act to appropriate from the general fund of the state funds for the world war II service compensation board.

WHEREAS, the fifty-second General Assembly appropriated eighty-five million dollars (\$85,000,000) to the world war II service compensation board for the purpose of service compensation to persons defined in section thirty-five A point four (35A.4), Code 1950, and

WHEREAS, the voters of the state of Iowa in the general election 1948, approved the same, and

WHEREAS, it now appears that said appropriation was insufficient to pay the persons defined in section thirty-five A point four (35A.4), Code 1950, and

WHEREAS, it is deemed necessary and proper that an additional appropriation should be made; now, therefore,

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 Section 1. There is hereby appropriated out of the general
2 fund of the State of Iowa, not already appropriated, to the
3 world war II service compensation board, the sum of seven
4 million eight hundred thousand dollars (\$7,800,000), or so
5 much thereof as may be necessary to pay the deficiency, to
6 any person defined in section thirty-five A point four (35A.4),
7 Code 1950, who has not heretofore been paid.

1 Sec. 2. The state comptroller is hereby authorized to
2 issue warrants to the world war II service compensation board

3 in the amount stated, and the state treasurer is hereby
4 authorized to pay the same to the general fund to the state of
5 Iowa.

1 Sec. 3. This act being deemed of immediate importance,
2 shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage
3 and publication in the Pomeroy Herald, a newspaper
4 published at Pomeroy, Iowa, and the Ft. Dodge Messenger,
5 a newspaper published at Ft. Dodge, Iowa.

EXPLANATION OF H. F. 62

Appropriations made by the Fifty-second General Assembly were insufficient to pay all of the persons defined in the Act. This bill is intended to make up the deficiency.
