Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

- 2 eleven (337.11), subsection eleven (11), Code 1950, is hereby
- 3 amended by striking the word "thirty-five" from line two (2)
- 4 and inserting in lieu thereof the word "fifty-five".

EXPLANATION OF H. F. 123

It is the duty of the sheriff to "serve each prisoner three times each day with an ample quantity of wholesome food" (Section 356.5(3)). In counties having a population of eighty thousand or more, the cost of feeding prisoners is paid by the board of supervisors (chapter 338). In all other counties the cost of food and the expense of preparing and serving the same must be paid by the sheriff. In view of the present cost of living, the fee now provided is inadequate, and this proposal is submitted in order that the sheriff may carry forward his duty of feeding prisoners without resorting to his own funds.
