A BILL FOR

An Act to amend sections 179.2, 179.5 and 179.6, Code 1950,
relating to the compensation of appointive members of the
Iowa Dairy Industry Commission and to the extension of
the annual butterfat tax period.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

.1 Section 1. Section one hundred seventy-nine point two
2 (179.2), Code 1950, is amended by striking from last line of
3 said section the words "three and one-half" and inserting in
4 lieu thereof the word "five".

1 Sec. 2. Section one hundred seventy-nine point five
2 (179.5), Code 1950, is amended by striking from lines four
3 (4) and five (5), the following words: "June 1 and terminating
4 June 15" and inserting in lieu thereof the following: "May 1
5 and terminating June 30".

1 Sec. 3. Section one hundred seventy-nine point six
2 (179.6), Code 1950, is amended by striking from line twelve
3 (12) the following words: "June 1 to June 15" and inserting
4 in lieu thereof the words: "May 1 to June 30".

1 Sec. 4. This Act being deemed of immediate importance

- 2 shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage
- 3 and publication in the Brooklyn Chronicle, a newspaper
- 4 published at Brooklyn, Iowa, and the Montezuma Republican,
- 5 a newspaper published at Montezuma, Iowa.

EXPLANATION OF H. F. 124

To protect and improve the health of our citizens by use of dairy products. To enlarge our statewide dairy nutrition education project. The producers' self-help program to protect their dairy investment.

Butter consumption has dropped because of little promotion, compared to competitive products.

Producers are requesting an enlarged and more effective dairy product promotion program. To accomplish this, we request that the present Butterfat Tax Law be amended to include the period of May and June, instead of the first fifteen days of June.
