A BILL FOR

An Act to provide headquarters for each congressionally chartered veterans' organization having a membership in the state of Iowa, and space in the state office building, when built, based on the numerical strength of said veterans' organizations.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

- 1 Section 1. There shall be provided by the executive
2 council of the state of Iowa, in the new state office
3 building, when built, space for the occupation of the
4 headquarters of each congressionally chartered veterans'
5 organization having a membership in the state of Iowa.
- 1 Sec. 2. Said space in said office buildings shall be
2 allocated on the basis of numerical strength in Iowa of
3 said organization on the following basis: A basic minimum
4 space of five hundred (500) square feet of floor space for
5 the first ten thousand (10,000) members or fraction thereof;
6 additional space of one hundred fifty (150) square feet
7 of floor space for each additional five thousand (5,000)
8 members or major fraction thereof.
- 1 Sec. 3. The numerical strength of said organization shall

2 be certified yearly to the executive council by each
3 organization desiring space. When desired by the executive
4 council an organization shall have its membership determined
5 by an audit of a certified public accountant.

1 Sec. 4. The space allocated to each organization shall be
2 known as the state headquarters of said veterans' organization.

EXPLANATION OF H. F. 279

This is a bill to provide state headquarters for each congressionally chartered veterans' organization having membership in the state of Iowa, in the proposed state office building. Such space to be determined by the numerical strength of each said veterans' organization in the state.
