A BILL FOR

An Act to amend section one hundred twenty-four point twenty-four (124.24), Code 1950, relating to permit fees for sale of malt beverages.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 Section 1. Amend section one hundred twenty-four point
2 twenty four (124.24), Code 1950, by striking the word "one"
3 in line nine (9) and by inserting in lieu thereof the word
4 "three", and by striking the words "three hundred" in line
5 ten (10), and by inserting in lieu thereof the words "one
6 thousand".

1 Sec. 2. Further amend section one hundred twenty-four
2 point twenty-four (124.24), Code 1950, by striking lines
3 four (4) to twelve (12), inclusive, of subsection three (3)
4 thereof, and by inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5 "The permit fee for class C permits shall not be less
6 than one hundred dollars nor more than three hundred dollars.

7 The permit fee for class B and class C permits, as set by
8 each separate licensing authority shall be the same amount.

9 The annual permit fee for special class B permits issued
10 under section one hundred twenty-four point fourteen (124.14)

11 shall be five hundred dollars, and twenty-five dollars for
12 each duplicate thereof, which fee shall be paid into the
13 state tax commission. The state tax commission shall issue
14 duplicates of such permits as applied for by each such
15 company.

EXPLANATION OF H. F. 555

The purpose of this bill is to increase the amount the issuing authority may charge for beer permits, and to equalize the fees between class B and class C permits.

Statistics show that actually more beer is sold by class C permit holders than by class B permit holders.
