A BILL FOR

An Act to amend chapter one hundred twenty-three (123),
Code 1950, to prevent the liquor control commission
from discriminating against a citizen of Iowa and to
provide a method of subpoenaing evidence from companies
selling liquor or wine to Iowa.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

- 1 Section 1. Amend chapter one hundred twenty-three (123),
- 2 Code 1950, by adding the following sections:
- 3 1. "The commission shall not make any rule or adopt any
- 4 practice which shall discriminate against any citizen of the
- 5 state of Iowa, nor grant any privilege or concession to any
- 6 nonresident of this state which is not as freely offered to
- 7 its citizens."
- 8 2. "Every contract of purchase of liquor or wine
- 9 shall carry an agreement thereon, granting permission by
- 10 the vendor to make available to any legally authorized
- 11 investigating body, their books and records which pertain
- 12 to transactions with the Iowa liquor control commission or

- 13 any citizen of this state and the privilege of subpoenaing
14 said records for use in this state.”

EXPLANATION OF H. F. 580

The purpose of this bill is to provide regulations to prevent the state liquor control commission from discriminating against Iowa citizens in their sales and purchases.
