A BILL FOR

An Act to grant perpetual existence without payment of fees to the Iowa Centennial Memorial Foundation, and to prescribe the duties of certain state officials with respect to the Iowa Centennial Memorial Foundation.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 Section 1. The Iowa Centennial Memorial Foundation
2 established on the fifth day of January, 1949, shall have
3 perpetual existence, and the certificate of incorporation
4 heretofore issued to the Iowa Centennial Memorial
5 Foundation by the secretary of state shall be deemed a
6 valid certificate of perpetual existence, and no corporation
7 fees shall hereafter be required to renew or continue its
8 existence.

1 Sec. 2. It shall be the duty of the Governor to
2 serve as president of the Iowa Centennial Memorial Foundation,
3 and it shall be the duty of the treasurer to serve as
4 treasurer of the Iowa Centennial Memorial Foundation, and it
5 shall be the duty of the Attorney General to serve as legal
6 counsel for the Iowa Centennial Memorial Foundation, and it

7 shall be the duty of the president of the State Board of
8 Education to serve as secretary of the Iowa Centennial
9 Memorial Foundation.

1 Sec. 3. The duties of the state officials
2 hereinbefore provided with respect to the Iowa Centennial
3 Memorial Foundation shall be a part of their official
4 duties pertaining to their respective offices.

1 Sec. 4. If any section, sub-section, paragraph,
2 sentence, clause or phrase of this act is for any reason
3 held to be unconstitutional and invalid, such unconstitu-
4 tionality or invalidity shall not affect the constitution-
5 ality or validity of the remaining portions of this act.
6 The General Assembly hereby declares that it would have
7 passed this act and each section, sub-section, paragraph,
8 sentence, clause or phrase hereof, irrespective of
9 whether any one or more of the sections, sub-sections,
10 paragraphs, sentences, clauses or phrases be declared
11 unconstitutional.

1 Sec. 5. This act being deemed of immediate
2 importance shall become effective upon its publication
3 in the, a newspaper published
4 at, Iowa, and in the,
5 a newspaper published at, Iowa.

EXPLANATION OF H. F. 631

There is no provision in the non-profit corporation chapter for perpetual existence. The Iowa Centennial Memorial Foundation was incorporated under this chapter. This is a companion bill giving statutory recognition to the Foundation as a state function and provides for perpetual existence, and prescribes the duties of state officials responsible for the administration of the Foundation.
