HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

A Joint Resolution creating a special committee to make a study of the operations of the Iowa old age and survivors' insurance system, to investigate into the proposal of uniting the Iowa old age and survivors system with the Federal social security system, and providing that such committee shall make a report of its findings to the governor of Iowa and to the Fifty-fifth General Assembly, and appropriating the sum of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this joint resolution.

WHEREAS, the state of Iowa now maintains an old age and survivors insurance system for the benefit and protection of all public employees of the state, corresponding in general to the provisions made by the Federal government in the social security system for the protection of private employees, and that there is a great lack of uniformity as between the Iowa system and the Federal social security provisions, and

WHEREAS, there is reason to believe that the inclusion of the Iowa public employees under the coverage of the federal plan as embodied in the Federal social security act, may be desirable in the future, now therefore,

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

- 1 Section 1. A special committee of seven (7) members
- 2 is hereby created, which committee shall consist of two (2)
- 3 members of the Fifty-fourth General Assembly to be appointed

4 by the president of the Senate; two (2) members of the Fifty-
5 fourth General Assembly to be appointed by the speaker of the
6 House of Representatives; one (1) member who shall be one of
7 the members of the Iowa employment security commission to be
8 designated by such commission, and two (2) citizens of the
9 state of Iowa to be appointed by the governor. Any vacancies
10 which may occur in the membership of the committee shall be
11 filled by appointment in the same manner and by the same
12 officials and from the same group as the original appointment.
13 The committee shall choose a chairman from among its members
14 and shall adopt the rules of conduct of its proceedings.

1 Sec. 2. It shall be the duty of the committee to make
2 a comprehensive study of the Iowa old age and survivors
3 insurance system; to make an investigation of the possibility
4 of uniting or consolidating the Iowa old age and survivors
5 system with the Federal social security program; to make an
6 investigation of the actuarial soundness of the Iowa old age
7 and survivors system and to make such recommendations and
8 findings as it deems desirable to the governor of Iowa and to
9 the members of the Fifty-fifth General Assembly.

1 Sec. 3. The committee shall have the co-operation of
2 the attorney general and his staff in the performance of the
3 duties herein imposed, and is authorized to call upon any
4 department of the state government in obtaining information
5 deemed useful to the committee.

1 Sec. 4. The committee shall confer if necessary with

2 Federal officials as to the possibility of uniting the Iowa
3 old age and survivors system with the Federal social security
4 system and shall have the power to co-operate with Federal
5 officials or members of congress in bringing about any necessary
6 changes in the present provisions of the Federal social
7 security act which would enable Iowa public employees to come
8 under the provisions of the Federal social security act.

1 Sec. 5. The committee shall enter into its duties as
2 soon as the membership has been appointed. It shall make a
3 report, including drafts of proposed bills, to the governor
4 on or before November 15, 1952. Upon the making of its said
5 report to the governor, the committee shall stand discharged
6 of its duties hereunder. The governor shall cause to be printed
7 the necessary number of copies of said report and shall mail
8 copies of said printed report to the elected members of the
9 Fifty-fifth General Assembly.

1 Sec. 6. The committee is hereby empowered to employ a
2 secretary and such other employees and assistants as are
3 necessary for the proper conduct of the business of the
4 committee, and to fix the compensation of such employees.
5 Members of the committee shall be reimbursed for the actual
6 and necessary expenses incurred by them in the discharge
7 of their duties. Members of the committee appointed by the
8 governor shall receive a compensation of twenty dollars
9 (\$20.00) per day for days actually engaged in work of the
10 committee. Legislative members of the committee shall receive

11 as compensation such amounts as the Fifty-fifth General
12 Assembly may allow.

13 The executive council shall provide the committee with
14 a suitable office and with necessary office supplies and
15 equipment for the conduct of its business.

1 Sec. 7. The compensation and expense of the committee
2 members and employees, the cost of office supplies and other
3 expenses of the committee incurred in the performance of
4 the duties herein imposed, and the cost of printing the
5 committee's report, but not exceeding fifteen thousand
6 dollars (\$15,000.00) in total amount, shall be paid by the
7 state comptroller out of the general fund of the state. The
8 sum of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000.00) or so much
9 thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of
10 the general fund of the state for the purposes herein
11 contemplated.

12 The chairman of the committee shall certify the
13 expenses of the committee as herein provided to the state
14 comptroller who shall issue warrants for the same from funds
15 heretofore appropriated.

1 Sec. 8. This Joint Resolution being deemed of
2 immediate importance shall be in full force and effect from

1 Sec. 4. The committee shall confer if necessary with
2 Federal officials as to the possibility of uniting the Iowa
3 old age and survivors' system with the Federal social security
4 system and shall have the power to cooperate with Federal
5 officials or members of congress in bringing about any necessary
6 changes in the present provisions of the Federal social
7 security act which would enable Iowa public employees to come

1 Sec. 5. After careful study and research the committee is
2 empowered to hold sectional meetings in different parts of the
3 state to acquaint public employees with the difference as to
4 payments, benefits and other merits and demerits between the
5 federal and the Iowa old age insurance systems.

1 Sec. 6. All meetings of this committee shall be held within
2 the borders of the state of Iowa.

1 Sec. 7. The committee shall enter into its duties as
2 soon as the membership has been appointed. It shall make a
3 report, including drafts of proposed bills, to the governor
4 on or before November 15, 1952. Upon the making of its said
5 report to the governor, the committee shall stand discharged
6 of its duties hereunder. The governor shall cause to be printed
7 the necessary number of copies of said report and shall mail
8 copies of said printed report to the elected members of the
9 Fifty-fifth General Assembly.

1 Sec. 8. The committee is hereby empowered to employ a
2 secretary and such other employees and assistants as are

3 necessary for the proper conduct of the business of the
4 committee, and to fix the compensation of such employees.
5 Members of the committee shall be reimbursed for the actual
6 and necessary expenses incurred by them in the discharge
7 of their duties. Members of the committee appointed by the
8 governor shall receive a compensation of twenty dollars (\$20.00)
9 per day for days actually engaged in work of the committee.
10 Legislative members of the committee shall receive as compensation
11 such amounts as the Fifty-fifth General Assembly may allow.

12 The executive council shall provide the committee with
13 a suitable office and with necessary office supplies and
14 equipment for the conduct of its business.

1 Sec. 9. The compensation and expense of committee
2 members and employees, the cost of office supplies and other
3 expenses of the committee incurred in the performance of
4 the duties herein imposed, and the cost of printing the
5 committee's report, but not exceeding ten thousand
6 dollars (\$10,000.00) in total amount, shall be paid by the
7 state comptroller out of the general fund of the state. The
8 sum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) or so much
9 thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of
10 the general fund of the state for the purposes herein
11 contemplated.

12 The chairman of the committee shall certify the
13 expenses of the committee as herein provided to the state
14 comptroller who shall issue warrants for the same from funds

15 heretofore appropriated.

1 Sec. 10. This Joint Resolution being deemed of
2 immediate importance shall be in full force and effect from
3 and after publication in Hawarden Independent, a newspaper
4 published at Hawarden, Iowa, and Cedar Falls Daily Record, a
5 newspaper published at Cedar Falls, Iowa.
