## A BILL FOR

An Act relating to the practice of barbering.

*Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:*

1 Section 1. Section one hundred fifty-eight point two  
2 (158.2), Code 1962, is amended by adding at the end thereof  
3 the following new paragraph:  
4 "Any person not within one of the hereinabove specified  
5 exceptions who performs or holds himself out as willing to  
6 perform any barber service to the general public without having  
7 first obtained a license to practice barbering or at a place  
8 not licensed as a barber shop or inspected by the state  
9 department of health, with or without compensation, shall  
10 be guilty of a misdemeanor."

1 Sec. 2. Section one hundred fifty-eight point four  
2 (158.4), Code 1962, is amended by striking from line two (2)  
3 the word "six" and inserting in lieu thereof the word "nine".  
4 Said section is further amended by striking from line  
5 seventeen (17) the word "eighteen" and inserting in lieu  
6 thereof the word "twenty-four"; and by striking from line  
7 eighteen (18) the word "eighteen" and inserting in lieu  
8 thereof the word "twenty-four".

### EXPLANATION OF HOUSE FILE 73

The purpose of section 1 is to protect the public health against spread of infectious and contagious disease of the hair and scalp and implement the enforcement of the existing law by closing the loophole that presently exists where the unlicensed practi-

tioner and his customers conspire to defeat prosecution by denying payment of compensation or resort to the subterfuge of calling it an "independent gift."

The purpose of section 2 is to upgrade the profession to the end that it may render increasingly better service to the general public.
