A BILL FOR

An Act to authorize the Iowa state commerce commission to enter into a contract with the United States government or any designated agency thereof for the purpose of releasing information pertaining to inspections of warehouses bonded and licensed under the provisions of chapter five hundred forty-three (543), Code 1962, and to authorize the Iowa state commerce commission to recover the cost of providing such information to the United States government or its agencies.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

- 1 Section 1. Section five hundred forty-three point two
- 2 (543.2), Code 1962, is amended by striking the period from
- 3 line eleven (11) immediately following the word "months" and
- 4 adding immediately thereafter the following:
- 5 "and the commission shall have authority to make available
- 6 to the United States government, or any of its agencies,
- 7 including the Commodity Credit Corporation, the results of
- 8 inspections made and inspection reports submitted to it by
- 9 employees of the commission, upon payment to it of such charges
- 10 as may be determined by the commission, but in no event shall
- 11 such charges be less than the actual cost of such services
- 12 rendered in regard thereto, as determined by the commission. The
- 13 commission shall have authority to enter into contracts and
- 14 agreements for such purpose and shall keep a record of all money
- 15 thus received. All such money shall be paid over to the treasurer
- 16 of state as miscellaneous receipts."

EXPLANATION OF HOUSE FILE 489

This bill will make it possible to eliminate the duplicate agricultural warehouse inspections now being performed by both the Iowa State Commerce Commission and the U. S. Department of Agriculture (agents for Commodity Credit Corporation) on bonded agricultural warehouses within the state which hold Uniform Grain Storage Agreements with Commodity Credit Corporation and would retain within the State of Iowa full authority for bonded warehouse supervision.
