A BILL FOR

An Act to require the state board of regents to cause the state university of Iowa and the Iowa state university of science and technology to provide courses of advanced and graduate level instruction at locations away from their respective campuses, and to make an appropriation therefor.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

- 1 Section 1. Section two hundred sixty-two point nine (262.9),
- 2 Code 1962, is hereby amended by adding thereto the following
- 3 subsection:
- 4 Require the state university of Iowa and the Iowa state
- 5 university of science and technology to make available at
- 6 locations away from the campuses of each, courses of advanced
- 7 and graduate level instruction in the physical science,
- 8 engineering and industrial management. For this purpose there
- 9 is hereby appropriated annually sixty thousand dollars
- 10 (\$60,000) from the general fund of the state of which sum
- 11 thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) shall be allocated to the
- 12 state university of Iowa and thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000)
- 13 shall be allocated to Iowa state university of science and
- 14 technology.

EXPLANATION OF HOUSE FILE 497

This bill will give employees in modern industry an opportunity to renew and increase their knowledge and skills and will promote growth of Iowa industry. In order to attract new industries to Iowa and to encourage educated young Iowans to remain in Iowa, we must provide opportunities for them to continue their studies while working. In such industries as space and electronics, rapid technical changes require constant up-dating of the education of scientists and engineers. Iowa industries just cannot attract or hold educated young Iowans unless such educations are available at places where industries are located.
