## A BILL FOR

An Act to appropriate funds to the state board of regents to expand existing fire training facilities at Iowa state university.

*Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:*

1 Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from the general  
2 fund of the state of Iowa to the state board of regents the sum  
3 of one hundred fifty thousand (150,000) dollars. The state board  
4 of regents may expend the money appropriated by this Act for  
5 the construction and equipment to expand existing fire service  
6 training facilities at Iowa state university. The facilities  
7 acquired under this Act shall be located on the campus of Iowa  
8 state university and shall be used as follows:

- 9 1. For fire research and testing.
- 10 2. Special large scale fire demonstrations.

1 Sec. 2. The state board of regents may obtain federal or  
2 private grants for the state of Iowa to be used in connection  
3 with the funds appropriated by this Act and in accordance with  
4 the terms and conditons set forth in this Act.

1 Sec. 3. Contracts, plans, and specifications for facilities  
2 acquired under this Act shall be approved and entered into by  
3 the state board of regents.

### EXPLANATION OF HOUSE FILE 584

The purpose of this bill is to provide money to expand existing fire service training facilities at Iowa State University. Because of the lack of facilities, many educational programs and research projects cannot now be carried out. The money appropriated by this act will be used for facilities which will be of direct benefit to every community in

the state of Iowa. These facilities will be used by over 900 volunteer fire departments and over 17,000 volunteer firemen who have no fire training facilities of their own. Without these facilities, volunteer firemen cannot get the necessary fire service training.

The facilities provided by this act will also supplement the training of the 23 paid fire departments in the state.
