## HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

A Joint Resolution proposing a constitutional amendment relating to constitutional conventions.

*Be It Resolved by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:*

1 Section 1. An amendment to the constitution of the state of  
2 Iowa is proposed as follows:  
3 "Section three (3) of Article Ten (X) of the constitution of  
4 the state of Iowa is hereby amended by adding the following at  
5 the end thereof:  
6 "Delegates to the convention to revise the constitution shall  
7 be elected on a population basis. Should the qualified electors  
8 of Iowa vote for a constitutional convention and the general  
9 assembly fail to provide for such election of delegates, the  
10 next general assembly shall be elected from the state at large,  
11 notwithstanding any other provisions of this Constitution.  
12 Any proposal or proposals passed by a majority of the delegates  
13 to the convention shall be submitted to the qualified electors  
14 to accept or reject at the next general election, and if ac-  
15 cepted the proposal shall constitute an amendment to the  
16 constitution of the state of Iowa."

### EXPLANATION OF H. J. R. 6

This resolution would require the delegates to a convention to be elected on a population basis and require submission of results to the electorate.
