A BILL FOR

An Act to amend chapter one hundred sixty-nine (169),
Code 1962, relating to veterinary medicine and surgery.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 Section 1. Section one hundred sixty-nine point two
2 (169.2), Code 1962, is amended by striking therefrom sub-
3 section three (3) and renumbering the remaining subsections.

1 Sec. 2. Section one hundred sixty-nine point fifteen
2 (169.15), Code 1962, is hereby amended by adding thereto
3 the following:

4 "Such board shall be known as the board of veterinary
5 medical examiners. Each examiner shall be actively engaged
6 in veterinary medicine and shall have been so engaged in this
7 state for a period of five (5) years just preceding his appointment.
8 No member of the board shall be associated with any wholesale
9 or jobbing house dealing in supplies, equipment or instruments
10 used or useful in the practice of veterinary medicine. The
11 chief of the division of animal industry of the department
12 shall serve as secretary to the board of veterinary medical
13 examiners."

1 Sec. 3. Section one hundred sixty-nine point sixteen
2 (169.16), Code 1962, is hereby amended by adding thereto the
3 following:

4 "The regular state veterinary medical association or

5 society or its managing board may submit each year to the
6 department of agriculture a list of six (6) persons of
7 recognized ability in the veterinary medical profession,
8 who have the qualifications prescribed for examiners. If
9 such list is submitted, the department of agriculture in
10 making an appointment to the board of examiners shall select
11 one of the persons so named."

1 Sec. 4. Section one hundred sixty-nine point eighteen
2 (169.18), Code 1962, is hereby amended by striking all of
3 said section and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

4 "Each member of the examining board shall, in addition
5 to necessary traveling and hotel expenses, receive ten
6 dollars (\$10.00) per day for each day actually engaged in
7 the discharge of his duties including compensation for the
8 time spent traveling to and from the place of conducting the
9 examination and for a reasonable number of days for the
10 preparation of examination and the reading of papers, in
11 addition to the time actually spent in conducting examinations.

1 Sec. 5. Section one hundred sixty-nine point twenty-three
2 (169.23), Code 1962, is hereby amended by striking from line
3 eleven (11) thereof the word "department" and substituting in
4 lieu thereof the words "examining board".

1 Sec. 6. Chapter one hundred sixty-nine (169), Code 1962,
2 is further amended by adding thereto the following new sections:

3 "The examining board is authorized to employ an inspector,
4 who shall not be a member of the examining board, at such per
5 diem compensation as shall be fixed by the executive council
6 and payable from a special fund in the office of the treasurer
7 of the state known as the state board of veterinary examiners

8 fund.”

9 “The department shall annually add four dollars (\$4.00) to
 10 the renewal fee provided in this chapter for a person licensed
 11 to practice veterinary medicine. Such additional amount shall
 12 be considered as a part of the regular renewal fee and payment
 13 of same by a licensee shall be a prerequisite to the renewal
 14 of his license. The funds derived from the additional
 15 renewal fee collected under this section shall be placed in a
 16 special fund by the treasurer of the state and the state
 17 comptroller to be known as the ‘State Board of Veterinary
 18 Examiners Fund’, to be used by the examining board to assist
 19 in administering and enforcing the laws relating to the practice
 20 of veterinary medicine, and no part of such expense shall be
 21 paid out of the state treasury. Any remainder in said fund at
 22 the end of each fiscal year shall be paid into the general fund
 23 of the state. Said fund shall be subject at all times to the
 24 warrant of the state comptroller, drawn upon written requisition
 25 of the chairman of the examining board and attested by the
 26 secretary, for the payment of all salaries, per diem expense,
 27 and other expenses necessary to administer and aid in the
 28 enforcement of the provisions of law relating to the practice
 29 of veterinary medicine, but in no event shall the total expenses
 30 therefore exceed the total fees collected and deposited to the
 31 credit of said fund.”
