A BILL FOR

An Act to appropriate from the general fund of the State of Iowa to the national guard and state guard for the purpose of various capital improvements, repairs, replacements, alterations, equipment and rehabilitation, and the purchase of an airplane to be utilized by the governor and other state officials.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

- 1 Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from the general fund
- 2 of the state to the national guard and state guard the sum of
- 3 three hundred thirty-eight thousand dollars (\$338,000.00) to be
- 4 used in the following manner:
- 5 For the state's share of the armory
- 6 construction program made available to the
- 7 states by the federal government for the
- 8 acquisition, construction, expansion,
- 9 rehabilitation and converting facilities
- 10 of the administration and training units of
- 11 the national guard and state guard\$100,000.00
- 12 For repairs, replacements, alterations,
- 13 equipment and rehabilitation of armories
- 14 in connection with which federal funds may
- 15 be accepted 50,000.00
- 16 For repairs, replacements, alterations,
- 17 equipment and rehabilitation of grounds,
- 18 buildings and roads at Camp Dodge, Iowa 40,000.00
- 19 For range construction program 50,000.00

20 For the purchase of a twin engine air-
21 craft to be assigned to the military
22 department for the support of adminis-
23 trative flights of the governor and other
24 state officials. The authority to assign
25 utilization of the aircraft shall be
26 vested in the executive council with the
27 assessing of maintenance and operational
28 costs on the basis of such utilization
29 vested in the adjutant general 98,000.00

1 Sec. 2. Before any of the funds herein appropriated shall be
2 expended, it shall be determined by the national guard and state
3 guard, with the approval of the budget and financial control
4 committee, that the expenditures shall be for the best interests
5 of the state.

1 Sec. 3. Upon completion of any project as set forth in this Act,
2 any unobligated balance remaining may be used to supplement any of
3 other appropriations herein provided except that this shall not apply
4 to the provision herein which provides for the aircraft.

1 Sec. 4. Any unencumbered balance remaining as of June 30,
2 1967, of the appropriation of this Act made by the Sixtieth
3 General Assembly, shall revert to the general fund of the state.

1 Sec. 5. This Act, being deemed of immediate importance shall
2 be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publica-
3 tion as provided by law, in The Boone News-Republican, a news-
4 paper published at Boone, Iowa, and in The Winterset Madisonian, a
5 newspaper published at Winterset, Iowa.
