**A BILL FOR**

1 An Act relating to moneys in the solid waste account of the  
2 groundwater protection fund.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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HF 255

1 Section 1. Section 455E.11, subsection 2, paragraph a,  
2 subparagraph (1), subparagraph subdivision (c), Code 2001, is  
3 amended to read as follows:

4 (c) Twenty-five cents shall be retained by the sanitary  
5 landfill operator for purposes of collecting household  
6 hazardous waste at regional collection centers. If a solid  
7 waste agency is not providing or partnering with another  
8 agency to provide household hazardous waste collection, the  
9 twenty-five cents from that area shall be retained by the  
10 department to assist with household hazardous waste disposal  
11 education.

12 (d) Provided local match moneys are available, seventy-  
13 five cents shall be retained by the sanitary landfill operator  
14 in accordance with section 455B.310 and shall be used only for  
15 any of the following:

16 (i) Curbside or drop-off recycling programs.

17 (ii) Yardwaste programs.

18 (iii) White goods recycling programs. For purposes of  
19 this subparagraph subdivision part, "white goods" means a  
20 major household appliance including a refrigerator, stove,  
21 oven, deep freeze freezer, dishwasher, clothes washer, clothes  
22 dryer, or microwave oven.

23 (iv) Household hazardous waste programs.

24 (v) Brown goods recycling programs. For purposes of this  
25 subparagraph subdivision part, "brown goods" means household  
26 or commercial electronic equipment.

27 (vi) Public awareness programs related to solid waste  
28 management and recycling.

29 (vii) School education programs related to solid waste  
30 management and recycling.

31 (e) The remaining funds shall be used by the department to  
32 develop and implement demonstration projects for landfill  
33 alternatives to solid waste disposal including recycling  
34 programs.

35 Sec. 2. Section 455E.11, subsection 2, paragraph a,

1 subparagraph (2), subparagraph subdivision (f), Code 2001, is  
2 amended to read as follows:

3 (f) Eight and one-half percent to the department to  
4 provide additional toxic cleanup days or other efforts of the  
5 department to support permanent household hazardous material  
6 collection systems and special events for household hazardous  
7 material collection~~7-and-for-the-natural-resource-geographic~~  
8 ~~information-system-required-under-section-455E-87-subsection~~  
9 6. Departmental rules adopted for implementation of toxic  
10 cleanup days shall provide sufficient flexibility to respond  
11 to the household hazardous material collection needs of both  
12 small and large communities. Repayment of moneys from the  
13 Iowa business loan program for waste reduction and recycling  
14 pursuant to section 455B.310, subsection 2, paragraph "b",  
15 Code 1993, and discontinued pursuant to 1993 Iowa Acts,  
16 chapter 176, section 45, shall be placed into this account to  
17 support household hazardous materials programs of the  
18 department.

19 EXPLANATION

20 This bill amends allocations of the solid waste account of  
21 the groundwater protection fund.

22 The bill provides that, out of every \$1.75 of the \$4.75  
23 tonnage fee, 75 cents shall be retained by the sanitary  
24 landfill operator for purposes of collecting household  
25 hazardous waste at regional collection centers. The bill also  
26 provides that, if local match moneys are available, 75 cents  
27 of the tonnage fee shall be retained by the sanitary landfill  
28 operator for purposes including curbside or drop-off recycling  
29 programs, yardwaste programs, white goods recycling programs,  
30 household hazardous waste programs, brown goods recycling  
31 programs, public awareness programs, and school education  
32 programs.

33 The bill eliminates the natural resource geographic  
34 information system as a purpose for which moneys from the  
35 solid waste account may be used.
