1 Section 1. Section 321.194, subsection 2, Code 2001, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 2. SUSPENSION AND REVOCATION. A driver's license issued
4 under this section is subject to suspension or revocation for
5 the same reasons and in the same manner as suspension or
6 revocation of any other driver's license. The department may
7 also suspend a driver's license issued under this section upon
8 receiving satisfactory evidence that the licensee has violated
9 the restrictions of the license or has been involved in one or
10 more accidents chargeable to the licensee. The department may
11 suspend a driver's license issued under this section upon
12 receiving a record of the licensee's conviction for one
13 violation. The department shall revoke the license upon
14 receiving a record of conviction for two or more violations of
15 a law of this state or a city ordinance regulating the
16 operation of motor vehicles on highways other than parking
17 violations as defined in section 321.210. After a person
18 licensed under this section receives two or more convictions
19 which require revocation of the person's license under this
20 section, the department shall not grant an application for a
21 new driver's license until the expiration of one year.
22 However, a person who has received two or more convictions
23 that require revocation of the person's license under this
24 section may apply for and receive an instruction permit under
25 section 321.180B.

26 EXPLANATION

27 This bill modifies a provision in Code section 321.194 that
28 currently prohibits a person who has had the person's school
29 driver's license revoked for violations relating to the
30 operation of a motor vehicle from receiving a new driver's
31 license for one year. The bill provides that the prohibition
32 on receiving a new driver's license for one year does not
33 apply to instruction permits issued under Code section
34 321.180B.
