A BILL FOR

1 An Act providing an apprenticeship program for Illinois barbers  
2 in lieu of existing Iowa barber licensure requirements.  
3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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HF 526

1 Section 1. Section 158.3, subsection 2, Code 2001, is  
2 amended to read as follows:

3 2. a. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection 1, any  
4 person who completes the application form prescribed by the  
5 board and who submits satisfactory proof of having been a  
6 licensed barber in another state for at least twelve months in  
7 the twenty-four month period preceding the submission of the  
8 application shall be allowed to take the examination for a  
9 license to practice barbering. However, the examination  
10 requirement shall be waived for those persons who submit  
11 evidence of licensure in another state which has a reciprocal  
12 agreement with the state of Iowa under the provisions of  
13 sections 147.44 to 147.49.

14 b. A barber licensed in the state of Illinois, or an  
15 individual who has not yet obtained a barber license in the  
16 state of Illinois but who graduated from a licensed barber  
17 school in the state of Illinois within the six-month period  
18 immediately preceding relocation to this state, shall,  
19 notwithstanding any other provision to the contrary, be exempt  
20 from any period of practice requirements under this subsection  
21 and the examination requirement shall be waived if the  
22 individual completes a six-month apprenticeship program under  
23 the supervision of a licensed Iowa barber and the licensed  
24 Iowa barber submits an affidavit to the board attesting to the  
5 qualifications of the Illinois applicant upon completion of  
6 the apprenticeship. The board shall establish apprenticeship  
7 program guidelines or requirements by rule.

EXPLANATION

This bill provides for an apprenticeship program for Illinois barbers or Illinois barber graduates in lieu of existing Iowa barber licensure requirements. The bill provides that a barber licensed in the state of Illinois, or an individual who has not yet obtained a barber license in the state of Illinois but who graduated from a licensed barber school in the state of Illinois within the six-month period

1 immediately preceding relocation to this state, shall be  
2 exempt from any period of practice requirements and the  
3 licensure examination requirement shall be waived provided  
4 that the person completes a six-month apprenticeship program  
5 under the supervision of a licensed Iowa barber, and the  
6 licensed Iowa barber submits an affidavit to the board of  
7 barber examiners attesting to the qualifications of the  
8 Illinois applicant upon completion of the apprenticeship. The  
9 bill provides that the board shall develop apprenticeship  
10 program guidelines or requirements by rule.
