**A BILL FOR**

1 An Act providing for reinstatement of emergency medical care

1 Section 1. EMERGENCY MEDICAL CARE PROVIDERS -- AMNESTY  
2 REINSTATEMENT.

3 1. An emergency medical care provider as defined in  
4 section 147A.1 who was previously certified pursuant to  
5 section 147A.6, and whose certification has expired may be  
6 reinstated subject to the following requirements:

7 a. An application for reinstatement shall be submitted on  
8 or before December 31, 2002.

9 b. The Iowa department of public health shall verify that  
10 the applicant possessed a previously active emergency medical  
11 services certification, and approve an application for  
12 reinstatement pursuant to this section.

13 c. Approved applicants shall complete refresher  
14 certification courses and submit a reinstatement fee, to be  
15 determined by the department by rule.

16 2. Reinstatement requirements shall be completed within  
17 six months of an approved reinstatement application. Upon  
18 successful completion of the requirements and payment of the  
19 fee, an applicant shall be reinstated without the necessity of  
20 passing any otherwise applicable practical or written  
21 certification examination.

22 EXPLANATION

23 This bill provides for the reinstatement of a previously  
24 certified emergency medical care provider whose certification  
25 has expired, without the necessity of passing a practical or  
26 written certification examination. The bill provides that an  
27 application for reinstatement shall be submitted on or before  
28 December 31, 2002. The bill provides that the Iowa department  
29 of public health shall verify that an applicant possessed a  
30 previously active emergency medical services certification,  
31 and approve the application. The bill additionally provides  
32 that an approved applicant shall complete required courses and  
33 pay a fee as established by rule, and shall complete the  
34 reinstatement requirements within six months of application  
35 approval.
