A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to permitted and prohibited occupations for
2 certain child laborers involving motor vehicle cleaning,
3 washing, and polishing, and providing an effective date.
4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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1 Section 1. Section 92.5, subsection 9, paragraph c, Code
2 2001, is amended to read as follows:

3 c. Car Motor vehicle cleaning, washing, and polishing,
4 including the use of power washers. Nothing in this
5 subsection shall be construed to include work involving the
6 use of pits, racks or lifting apparatus or involving the
7 inflation of any tire mounted on a rim equipped with a
8 removable retaining ring.

9 Sec. 2. Section 92.6, subsection 6, Code 2001, is amended
10 to read as follows:

11 6. Operation or tending of hoisting apparatus or of any
12 power-driven machinery, other than power washers in motor
13 vehicle cleaning, washing, and polishing, and office machines
14 and machines in retail, food service, and gasoline service
15 establishments which are specified in section 92.5 as machines
16 which such minors may operate in such establishments.

17 Sec. 3. Section 92.8, subsection 19, Code 2001, is amended
18 to read as follows:

19 19. Occupations involving exposure to lead fumes or its
20 compounds, or to dangerous or poisonous dyes or chemicals.
21 This subsection shall not be construed to include the use of
22 detergents, cleaners, and protectants in work involving motor
23 vehicle cleaning, washing, and polishing, if the person
24 employed is provided with and uses personal protective
25 equipment as needed.

26 Sec. 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act, being deemed of
27 immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.

28 EXPLANATION

29 This bill amends the child labor laws to provide that a
30 child under the age of 16 shall be permitted to use a power
31 washer in the permitted occupations of motor vehicle cleaning,
32 washing, and polishing. Current Code lists as a prohibited
33 occupation for persons under age 18 those occupations
34 involving exposure to lead fumes or its compounds, or to
35 dangerous or poisonous dyes or chemicals. The bill exempts

1 from this prohibition the use of detergents, cleaners, and
2 protectants in work involving motor vehicle cleaning, washing,
3 and polishing, if the child employed is provided with and uses
4 personal protective equipment as needed.

5 The bill takes effect upon enactment.

1 Section 1. Section 92.8, subsection 19, Code 2001, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 19. Occupations involving exposure to lead fumes or its
4 compounds, or to dangerous or poisonous dyes or chemicals.
5 This subsection shall not be construed to include the use of
6 detergents, cleaners, and protectants in work involving motor
7 vehicle cleaning, washing, and polishing if the person
8 employed is provided with and uses personal protective
9 equipment as needed provided the person under eighteen years
10 of age shall not be employed or permitted to combine the
11 chemicals which constitute the detergents, cleaners, or
12 protectants used to wash, clean, or polish motor vehicles
13 other than to dilute the detergents, cleaners, and protectants
14 with water. However, use of a power washer, ladder, scaffold,
15 or their substitutes by a person employed in work involving
16 motor vehicle cleaning, washing, and polishing, who is
17 fourteen or fifteen years of age, is prohibited pursuant to
18 section 92.6, or rules adopted pursuant to section 92.6.

19 Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act, being deemed of
20 immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.

21 EXPLANATION

22 This bill amends the child labor laws to provide that a
23 child under the age of 18 shall be permitted to use
24 detergents, cleaners, and protectants in motor vehicle
25 cleaning, washing, and polishing under certain conditions.

26 Current Code lists as a prohibited occupation for persons
27 under age 18 those occupations involving exposure to lead
28 fumes or its compounds, or to dangerous or poisonous dyes or
29 chemicals. The bill exempts from this prohibition the use of
30 detergents, cleaners, and protectants in work involving motor
31 vehicle cleaning, washing, and polishing, if the child
32 employed does not combine the chemicals, cleaners, and
33 protectants other than to dilute them with water and if the
34 child is provided with and uses personal protective equipment
35 as needed.

1 The bill also provides that use of a power washer, ladder,
2 scaffold, or their substitutes by a person 14 or 15 years of
3 age is prohibited.

4 The bill takes effect upon enactment.

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
