A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to and making appropriations from the senior

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. DEPARTMENT OF ELDER AFFAIRS APPROPRIATION --
2 SENIOR LIVING TRUST FUND. There is appropriated from the
3 senior living trust fund created in section 249H.4 to the
4 department of elder affairs for the fiscal year beginning July
5 1, 2002, and ending June 30, 2003, the following amount, or so
6 much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purpose
7 designated:

8 For the development and implementation of a comprehensive
9 senior living program, including program administration and
10 costs associated with implementation, salaries, support,
11 maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes and for not more than
12 the following full-time equivalent positions:

13 \$ 6,553,967
14 FTEs 8.00

15 Sec. 2. DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES APPROPRIATION --
16 SENIOR LIVING TRUST FUND. There is appropriated from the
17 senior living trust fund created in section 249H.4 to the
18 department of human services for the fiscal year beginning
19 July 1, 2002, and ending June 30, 2003, the following amounts,
20 or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the
21 purposes designated:

22 1. To supplement the medical assistance appropriation and
23 to provide reimbursement for health care services and rent
24 expenses to eligible persons through the home and community-
25 based services waiver and the state supplementary assistance
26 program, including program administration and data system
27 costs associated with implementation, salaries, support,
28 maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes and for not more than
29 the following full-time equivalent positions:

32 2. To implement nursing facility provider reimbursement
33 based upon a case-mix reimbursement methodology:

35 In order to carry out the purposes of this subsection, the

1 department shall transfer funds appropriated in this section
2 to supplement other appropriations to the department of human
3 services.

4 3. Notwithstanding sections 249H.4 and 249H.5, the
5 department of human services may use moneys from the senior
6 living trust fund for cash flow purposes to make payments
7 under the nursing facility or hospital upper payment limit
8 methodology. The amount of any moneys so used shall be
9 refunded to the senior living trust fund within the same
10 fiscal year and in a prompt manner.

11 4. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys committed to
12 grantees under contract to provide for conversion to assisted
13 living programs or for development of long-term care
14 alternatives that remain unexpended at the close of the fiscal
15 year shall not revert to any fund but shall remain available
16 for expenditure for purposes of the contract during the
17 succeeding fiscal year.

18 Sec. 3. CONVERSION GRANT PROJECTS -- RULES -- INTENT.

19 1. The department of human services shall adopt rules that
20 provide that beginning with applications for conversion grants
21 received on or after July 1, 2002, the department shall give
22 greater weight in the scoring methodology to nursing facility
23 conversion projects that are primarily for the renovation and
24 remodeling of the existing nursing facility structure and give
25 less weight to conversion projects that are primarily for new
26 construction. The department of human services shall
27 encourage cooperative efforts between the department of
28 inspections and appeals, the state fire marshal, and the grant
29 applicant to promote the acceptance of nursing facility
30 conversion projects that are primarily renovation and
31 remodeling of the existing nursing facility structure.

32 2. The department of elder affairs shall certify all
33 assisted living programs established through nursing facility
34 conversion grants. The department of elder affairs shall
35 consult with conversion grant applicants and recipients to

1 establish and monitor occupancy agreements and assisted living
2 program residents shall be allowed access to third-party
3 payors. The department of elder affairs shall allow grant
4 recipients to revise and modify occupancy agreements to
5 reflect rates that are affordable, as defined in section
6 249H.3, during the ten-year period of operation following the
7 awarding of the grant by the department of human services.

8 Sec. 4. DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES APPROPRIATION --
9 HOSPITAL TRUST FUND. There is appropriated from the hospital
10 trust fund created in section 249I.4 to the department of
11 human services for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2002, and
12 ending June 30, 2003, the following amount, or so much thereof
13 as is necessary, to be used for the purpose designated:

14 To supplement the medical assistance appropriation:
15 \$ 12,000,000

16 Sec. 5. 2001 Iowa Acts, chapter 192, section 2, subsection
17 1, is amended by adding the following new unnumbered
18 paragraph:

19 NEW UNNUMBERED PARAGRAPH. Notwithstanding section 8.33,
20 moneys committed to grantees under contract pursuant to this
21 subsection that remain unexpended at the close of the fiscal
22 year shall not revert to any fund but shall remain available
23 for purposes of the contract during the succeeding fiscal
24 year.

25 Sec. 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. Section 5 of this Act amending
26 2001 Iowa Acts, chapter 192, being deemed of immediate
27 importance, takes effect upon enactment.

28 EXPLANATION

29 This bill makes appropriations from the senior living trust
30 fund to the department of elder affairs and department of
31 human services and from the hospital trust fund to the
32 department of human services.

33 The appropriation from the senior living trust fund to the
34 department of elder affairs provides funding for development
35 and implementation of a comprehensive senior living program.

1 The appropriation from the senior living trust fund to the
2 department of human services provides funding for
3 supplementation of the medical assistance appropriation and to
4 provide funding for reimbursement of health care services and
5 rent expenses provided to persons through the home and
6 community-based services waiver and the state supplementary
7 assistance program; and funding for reimbursement of nursing
8 facility providers under a case-mix reimbursement methodology.

9 The bill also provides that the department of human
10 services may use moneys from the senior living trust fund for
11 cash flow purposes to make payments under the nursing facility
12 or hospital upper payment limit methodology and these moneys
13 must be refunded to the fund in the same fiscal year in which
14 used and in a prompt manner.

15 The bill provides that the moneys appropriated to the
16 department of human services for the fiscal year beginning
17 July 1, 2002, and ending June 30, 2003, that are committed to
18 grantees under contract to provide for conversion to assisted
19 living programs or for long-term care alternatives are not to
20 revert to any fund, but are to remain available for
21 expenditure for purposes of the contract for the subsequent
22 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003.

23 The bill directs the department of human services to adopt
24 rules to provide that beginning with applications for
25 conversion grants received on or after July 1, 2002, the
26 department is to give greater weight in the scoring
27 methodology to nursing facility conversion projects that are
28 primarily for the renovation and remodeling of the existing
29 nursing facility structure and give less weight to conversion
30 projects that are primarily for new construction. The bill
31 directs the department of human services to encourage
32 cooperative efforts between the department of inspections and
33 appeals, the state fire marshal, and the grant applicant to
34 promote the acceptance of nursing facility conversion projects
35 that are primarily renovation and remodeling of the existing

1 nursing facility structure. The bill also directs the
2 department of elder affairs to certify all assisted living
3 programs established through nursing facility conversion
4 grants. The department of elder affairs is to consult with
5 conversion grant applicants and recipients to establish and
6 monitor occupancy agreements and assisted living program
7 residents are to be allowed access to third-party payors. The
8 bill directs the department of elder affairs to allow grant
9 recipients to revise and modify occupancy agreements to
10 reflect rates that are affordable during the 10-year period of
11 operation following the awarding of the grant.

12 The bill makes an appropriation from the hospital trust
13 fund to the department of human services to supplement the
14 medical assistance appropriation.

15 The bill amends the language in 2001 Iowa Acts, chapter
16 192, that relates to the appropriation to the department of
17 human services for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, and
18 ending June 30, 2002, to provide that moneys that are
19 committed to grantees under contract to provide for conversion
20 to assisted living programs or for long-term care alternatives
21 are not to revert to any fund, but are to remain available for
22 expenditure for purposes of the contract for the subsequent
23 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2002. This section of the bill
24 takes effect upon enactment.

There is appropriated from the hospital trust fund created in section 249I.4 to the department of human services for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2002, and ending June 30, 2003, the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purpose designated:

To supplement the medical assistance appropriation:
..... \$ 12,000,000

Sec. 6. 2001 Iowa Acts, chapter 192, section 2, subsection 1, is amended by adding the following new unnumbered paragraph:

NEW UNNUMBERED PARAGRAPH. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys committed to grantees under contract pursuant to this subsection that remain unexpended at the close of the fiscal year shall not revert to any fund but shall remain available for purposes of the contract during the succeeding fiscal year.

Sec. 7. EFFECTIVE DATE. Section 6 of this Act amending 2001 Iowa Acts, chapter 192, being deemed of immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.

Sec. 8. EFFECTIVE DATE RETROACTIVE APPLICABILITY. Section 4 of this Act, relating to a nursing facility conversion grants moratorium, being deemed of immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment, and is retroactively applicable to April 1, 2002.
