

1 Section 1. SUBSTANCE ABUSE APPROPRIATION.

2 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section
3 8.41 to the Iowa department of public health for the federal
4 fiscal year beginning October 1, 2001, and ending September
5 30, 2002, the following amount:

6 \$ 12,698,390

7 a. Funds appropriated in this subsection are the
8 anticipated funds to be received from the federal government
9 for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C.,
10 chapter 6A, subchapter XVII, which provides for the substance
11 abuse prevention and treatment block grant. The department
12 shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as
13 provided in the federal law making the funds available and in
14 conformance with chapter 17A.

15 b. Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount
16 not exceeding 5 percent shall be used by the department for
17 administrative expenses.

18 c. The department shall expend no less than an amount
19 equal to the amount expended for treatment services in the
20 state fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, for pregnant women
21 and women with dependent children.

22 d. Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount
23 not exceeding \$24,585 shall be used for audits.

24 2. The funds remaining from the appropriation made in
25 subsection 1 shall be allocated as follows:

26 a. At least 20 percent of the allocation shall be for
27 prevention programs.

28 b. At least 35 percent of the allocation shall be spent on
29 drug treatment and prevention activities.

30 c. At least 35 percent of the allocation shall be spent on
31 alcohol treatment and prevention activities.

32 3. The substance abuse block grant funds received from the
33 federal government in excess of the amount of the anticipated
34 federal fiscal year 2001-2002 award appropriated in subsection
35 1 shall be distributed at least 50 percent to treatment

1 programs and 50 percent to prevention programs except that,
2 based upon federal guidelines, the total amount of the excess
3 awarded to prevention programs shall not exceed \$1,000,000.

4 Sec. 2. COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES APPROPRIATION.

5 1. a. There is appropriated from the fund created by
6 section 8.41 to the Iowa department of human services for the
7 federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 2001, and ending
8 September 30, 2002, the following amount:

9 \$ 2,740,750

10 b. Funds appropriated in this subsection are the
11 anticipated funds to be received from the federal government
12 for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C.,
13 chapter 6A, subchapter XVII, which provides for the community
14 mental health services block grant. The department shall
15 expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided
16 in the federal law making the funds available and in
17 conformance with chapter 17A.

18 c. The administrator of the division of mental health and
19 developmental disabilities of the department of human services
20 shall allocate not less than 95 percent of the amount of the
21 block grant to eligible community mental health services
22 providers for carrying out the plan submitted to and approved
23 by the federal substance abuse and mental health services
24 administration for the fiscal year involved.

25 2. An amount not exceeding 5 percent of the funds
26 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the department
27 of human services for administrative expenses. From the funds
28 set aside by this subsection for administrative expenses, the
29 division of mental health and developmental disabilities shall
30 pay to the auditor of state an amount sufficient to pay the
31 cost of auditing the use and administration of the state's
32 portion of the funds appropriated in subsection 1. The
33 auditor of state shall bill the division of mental health and
34 developmental disabilities for the costs of the audits.

35 Sec. 3. MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH SERVICES APPROPRIATIONS.

1 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section
2 8.41 to the Iowa department of public health for the federal
3 fiscal year beginning October 1, 2001, and ending September
4 30, 2002, the following amount:

5 \$ 7,022,990

6 The funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds
7 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
8 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 7,
9 subchapter V, which provides for the maternal and child health
10 services block grant. The department shall expend the funds
11 appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law
12 making the funds available and in conformance with chapter
13 17A.

14 Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount not
15 exceeding \$45,700 shall be used for audits.

16 Funds appropriated in this subsection shall not be used by
17 the university of Iowa hospitals and clinics for indirect
18 costs.

19 2. An amount not exceeding \$150,000 of the funds
20 appropriated in subsection 1 to the Iowa department of public
21 health shall be used by the Iowa department of public health
22 for administrative expenses in addition to the amount to be
23 used for audits in subsection 1.

24 The departments of public health, human services, and
25 education and the university of Iowa's mobile and regional
26 child health specialty clinics shall continue to pursue to the
27 maximum extent feasible the coordination and integration of
28 services to women and children.

29 3. a. Sixty-three percent of the remaining funds
30 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be allocated to supplement
31 appropriations for maternal and child health programs within
32 the Iowa department of public health. Of these funds,
33 \$284,548 shall be set aside for the statewide perinatal care
34 program.

35 b. Thirty-seven percent of the remaining funds

1 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be allocated to the
 2 university of Iowa hospitals and clinics under the control of
 3 the state board of regents for mobile and regional child
 4 health specialty clinics. The university of Iowa hospitals
 5 and clinics shall not receive an allocation for indirect costs
 6 from the funds for this program. Priority shall be given to
 7 establishment and maintenance of a statewide system of mobile
 8 and regional child health specialty clinics.

9 4. The Iowa department of public health shall administer
 10 the statewide maternal and child health program and the
 11 crippled children's program by conducting mobile and regional
 12 child health specialty clinics and conducting other activities
 13 to improve the health of low-income women and children and to
 14 promote the welfare of children with actual or potential
 15 handicapping conditions and chronic illnesses in accordance
 16 with the requirements of Title V of the federal Social
 17 Security Act.

18 Sec. 4. PREVENTIVE HEALTH AND HEALTH SERVICES
 19 APPROPRIATIONS.

20 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section
 21 8.41 to the Iowa department of public health for the federal
 22 fiscal year beginning October 1, 2001, and ending September
 23 30, 2002, the following amount:

24 \$ 1,941,706

25 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds
 26 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
 27 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 6A,
 28 subchapter XVII, which provides for the preventive health and
 29 health services block grant. The department shall expend the
 30 funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the
 31 federal law making the funds available and in conformance with
 32 chapter 17A.

33 Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount not
 34 exceeding \$5,522 shall be used for audits.

35 2. Of the funds appropriated in subsection 1, the specific

1 amount of funds stipulated by the notice of block grant award
2 shall be allocated for services to victims of sex offenses and
3 for rape prevention education.

4 3. After deducting the funds allocated in subsections 1
5 and 2, an amount not exceeding \$94,670 of the remaining funds
6 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the Iowa
7 department of public health for administrative expenses in
8 addition to the amount to be used for audits in subsection 1.

9 4. After deducting the funds allocated in subsections 1,
10 2, and 3, the remaining funds appropriated in subsection 1
11 shall be used by the department for healthy people
12 2010/healthy Iowans 2010 program objectives, preventive health
13 advisory committee, and risk reduction services, including
14 nutrition programs, health incentive programs, chronic disease
15 services, emergency medical services, monitoring of the
16 fluoridation program and start-up fluoridation grants, and
17 acquired immune deficiency syndrome services. The moneys
18 specified in this subsection shall not be used by the
19 university of Iowa hospitals and clinics or by the state
20 hygienic laboratory for the funding of indirect costs. Of the
21 funds used by the department under this subsection, an amount
22 not exceeding \$90,000 shall be used for the monitoring of the
23 fluoridation program and for start-up fluoridation grants to
24 public water systems, and an amount not exceeding \$50,000
25 shall be used to provide chlamydia testing.

26 Sec. 5. DRUG CONTROL AND SYSTEM IMPROVEMENT GRANT PROGRAM
27 APPROPRIATION.

28 1. There is appropriated from the fund created in section
29 8.41 to the office of the governor for the drug policy
30 coordinator for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1,
31 2001, and ending September 30, 2002, the following amount:
32 \$ 5,658,361

33 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the anticipated
34 funds to be received from the federal government for the
35 designated fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 46, subchapter

1 V, which provides for the drug control and system improvement
2 grant program. The drug policy coordinator shall expend the
3 funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the
4 federal law making the funds available and in conformance with
5 chapter 17A.

6 2. An amount not exceeding 7 percent of the funds
7 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the drug policy
8 coordinator for administrative expenses. From the funds set
9 aside by this subsection for administrative expenses, the drug
10 policy coordinator shall pay to the auditor of state an amount
11 sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use and
12 administration of the state's portion of the funds
13 appropriated in subsection 1.

14 Sec. 6. STOP VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN GRANT PROGRAM
15 APPROPRIATION.

16 1. There is appropriated from the fund created in section
17 8.41 to the office of the governor for the drug policy
18 coordinator for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1,
19 2001, and ending September 30, 2002, the following amount:
20 \$ 1,592,000

21 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the anticipated
22 funds to be received from the federal government for the
23 designated fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 46, subchapter
24 XII-H, which provides for grants to combat violent crimes
25 against women. The drug policy coordinator shall expend the
26 funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the
27 federal law making the funds available and in conformance with
28 chapter 17A.

29 2. An amount not exceeding 5 percent of the funds
30 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the drug policy
31 coordinator for administrative expenses. From the funds set
32 aside by this subsection for administrative expenses, the drug
33 policy coordinator shall pay to the auditor of the state an
34 amount sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use and
35 administration of the state's portion of the funds

1 appropriated in subsection 1.

2 Sec. 7. LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT BLOCK GRANT APPROPRIATION.

3 1. There is appropriated from the fund created in section
4 8.41 to the office of the governor for the drug policy
5 coordinator for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1,
6 2001, and ending September 30, 2002, the following amount:

7 \$ 299,867

8 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds
9 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
10 designated federal fiscal year under annual federal
11 appropriations which provide for grants to reduce crime and
12 improve public safety. The drug policy coordinator shall
13 expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided
14 in the federal law making the funds available and in
15 conformance with chapter 17A.

16 2. An amount not exceeding 3 percent of the funds
17 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the drug policy
18 coordinator for administrative expenses. From the funds set
19 aside by this subsection for administrative expenses, the drug
20 policy coordinator shall pay to the auditor of state an amount
21 sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use and
22 administration of the state's portion of the funds
23 appropriated in subsection 1.

24 Sec. 8. RESIDENTIAL SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT FOR STATE
25 PRISONERS FORMULA GRANT PROGRAM. There is appropriated from
26 the fund created in section 8.41 to the office of the governor
27 for the drug policy coordinator for the federal fiscal year
28 beginning October 1, 2001, and ending September 30, 2002, the
29 following amount:

30 \$ 501,966

31 Funds appropriated in this section are the funds
32 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
33 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 136,
34 which provides grants for substance abuse treatment programs
35 in state and local correctional facilities. The drug policy

1 coordinator shall expend the funds appropriated in this
2 section as provided in the federal law making the funds
3 available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

4 Sec. 9. COMMUNITY SERVICES APPROPRIATIONS.

5 1. a. There is appropriated from the fund created by
6 section 8.41 to the division of community action agencies of
7 the department of human rights for the federal fiscal year
8 beginning October 1, 2001, and ending September 30, 2002, the
9 following amount:

10 \$ 6,454,776

11 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds
12 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
13 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 106,
14 which provides for the community services block grant. The
15 division of community action agencies of the department of
16 human rights shall expend the funds appropriated in this
17 subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds
18 available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

19 b. The administrator of the division of community action
20 agencies of the department of human rights shall allocate not
21 less than 96 percent of the amount of the block grant to
22 eligible community action agencies for programs benefiting
23 low-income persons. Each eligible agency shall receive a
24 minimum allocation of not less than \$100,000. The minimum
25 allocation shall be achieved by redistributing increased funds
26 from agencies experiencing a greater share of available funds.
27 The funds shall be distributed on the basis of the poverty-
28 level population in the area represented by the community
29 action areas compared to the size of the poverty-level
30 population in the state.

31 2. An amount not exceeding 4 percent of the funds
32 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the division of
33 community action agencies of the department of human rights
34 for administrative expenses. From the funds set aside by this
35 subsection for administrative expenses, the division of

1 community action agencies of the department of human rights
2 shall pay to the auditor of state an amount sufficient to pay
3 the cost of auditing the use and administration of the state's
4 portion of the funds appropriated in subsection 1. The
5 auditor of state shall bill the division of community action
6 agencies for the costs of the audits.

7 Sec. 10. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT APPROPRIATIONS.

8 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section
9 8.41 to the department of economic development for the federal
10 fiscal year beginning October 1, 2001, and ending September
11 30, 2002, the following amount:

12 \$ 31,306,000

13 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds
14 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
15 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 69,
16 which provides for community development block grants. The
17 department of economic development shall expend the funds
18 appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law
19 making the funds available and in conformance with chapter
20 17A.

21 2. An amount not exceeding \$1,452,240 for the federal
22 fiscal year beginning October 1, 2001, shall be used by the
23 department of economic development for administrative expenses
24 for the community development block grant. The total amount
25 used for administrative expenses includes \$726,120 for the
26 federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 2001, of funds
27 appropriated in subsection 1 and a matching contribution from
28 the state equal to \$726,120 from the appropriation of state
29 funds for the community development block grant and state
30 appropriations for related activities of the department of
31 economic development. From the funds set aside for
32 administrative expenses by this subsection, the department of
33 economic development shall pay to the auditor of state an
34 amount sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use and
35 administration of the state's portion of the funds

1 appropriated in subsection 1. The auditor of state shall bill
2 the department for the costs of the audit.

3 Sec. 11. LOW-INCOME HOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE APPROPRIATIONS.

4 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section
5 8.41 to the division of community action agencies of the
6 department of human rights for the federal fiscal year
7 beginning October 1, 2001, and ending September 30, 2002, the
8 following amount:

9 \$ 25,541,963

10 The funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds
11 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
12 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 94,
13 subchapter II, which provides for the low-income home energy
14 assistance block grants. The division of community action
15 agencies of the department of human rights shall expend the
16 funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the
17 federal law making the funds available and in conformance with
18 chapter 17A.

19 2. Up to 15 percent of the amount appropriated in this
20 section that is actually received shall be used for
21 residential weatherization or other related home repairs for
22 low-income households. In order to receive low-income home
23 energy assistance program funding, the head of an eligible
24 household must be willing to allow residential weatherization
25 or other related home repairs. However, if the eligible
26 household is located in rental property, the unwillingness of
27 the property owner to allow residential weatherization or
28 other related home repairs shall not prevent the eligible
29 household from receiving low-income home energy assistance
30 program funding.

31 3. After subtracting the allocation in subsection 2, up to
32 \$1,695,859 is allocated for administrative expenses of the
33 low-income home energy assistance program of which \$290,000 is
34 allocated for administrative expenses of the division. The
35 costs of auditing the use and administration of the portion of

1 the appropriation in this section that is retained by the
2 state shall be paid from the amount allocated in this
3 subsection to the division. The auditor of state shall bill
4 the division for the audit costs.

5 4. The remainder of the appropriation in this section
6 following the allocations made in subsections 2 and 3, shall
7 be used to help eligible households as defined in 42 U.S.C.,
8 chapter 94, subchapter II, to meet home energy costs.

9 5. Not more than 10 percent of the amount appropriated in
10 this section that is actually received, may be carried forward
11 for use in the succeeding federal fiscal year.

12 6. Expenditures for assessment and resolution of energy
13 problems shall be limited to 5 percent of the amount
14 appropriated in this section that is actually received.

15 Sec. 12. SOCIAL SERVICES APPROPRIATIONS.

16 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section
17 8.41 to the department of human services for the federal
18 fiscal year beginning October 1, 2001, and ending September
19 30, 2002, the following amount:

20 \$ 18,531,000

21 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds
22 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
23 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 7,
24 subchapter XX, which provides for the social services block
25 grant. The department of human services shall expend the
26 funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the
27 federal law making the funds available and in conformance with
28 chapter 17A.

29 2. Not more than \$1,178,341 of the funds appropriated in
30 subsection 1 shall be used by the department of human services
31 for general administration. From the funds set aside in this
32 subsection for general administration, the department of human
33 services shall pay to the auditor of state an amount
34 sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use and
35 administration of the state's portion of the funds

1 appropriated in subsection 1.

2 3. In addition to the allocation for general
3 administration in subsection 2, the remaining funds
4 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be allocated in the
5 following amounts to supplement appropriations for the federal
6 fiscal year beginning October 1, 2001, for the following
7 programs within the department of human services:

- 8 a. Field operations:
9 \$ 7,047,791
- 10 b. Child and family services:
11 \$ 1,054,155
- 12 c. Local administrative costs and other local services:
13 \$ 747,438
- 14 d. Volunteers:
15 \$ 81,688
- 16 e. Community-based services:
17 \$ 93,940
- 18 f. MH/MR/DD/BI community service (local purchase):
19 \$ 8,327,647

20 Sec. 13. SOCIAL SERVICES BLOCK GRANT PLAN. The department
21 of human services during each state fiscal year shall develop
22 a plan for the use of federal social services block grant
23 funds for the subsequent state fiscal year.

24 The proposed plan shall include all programs and services
25 at the state level which the department proposes to fund with
26 federal social services block grant funds, and shall identify
27 state and other funds which the department proposes to use to
28 fund the state programs and services.

29 The proposed plan shall also include all local programs and
30 services which are eligible to be funded with federal social
31 services block grant funds, the total amount of federal social
32 services block grant funds available for the local programs
33 and services, and the manner of distribution of the federal
34 social services block grant funds to the counties. The
35 proposed plan shall identify state and local funds which will

1 be used to fund the local programs and services.

2 The proposed plan shall be submitted with the department's
3 budget requests to the governor and the general assembly.

4 Sec. 14. PROJECTS FOR ASSISTANCE IN TRANSITION FROM
5 HOMELESSNESS. Upon receipt of the minimum formula grant from
6 the federal alcohol, drug abuse, and mental health
7 administration to provide mental health services for the
8 homeless, for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1,
9 2001, and ending September 30, 2002, the division of mental
10 health and developmental disabilities of the department of
11 human services shall assure that a project which receives
12 funds under the formula grant from either the federal or local
13 match share of 25 percent in order to provide outreach
14 services to persons who are chronically mentally ill and
15 homeless or who are subject to a significant probability of
16 becoming homeless shall do all of the following:

17 1. Provide community mental health services, diagnostic
18 services, crisis intervention services, and habilitation and
19 rehabilitation services.

20 2. Refer clients to medical facilities for necessary
21 hospital services, and to entities that provide primary health
22 services and substance abuse services.

23 3. Provide appropriate training to persons who provide
24 services to persons targeted by the grant.

25 4. Provide case management to homeless persons.

26 5. Provide supportive and supervisory services to certain
27 homeless persons living in residential settings which are not
28 otherwise supported.

29 6. Projects may expend funds for housing services
30 including minor renovation, expansion and repair of housing,
31 security deposits, planning of housing, technical assistance
32 in applying for housing, improving the coordination of housing
33 services, the costs associated with matching eligible homeless
34 individuals with appropriate housing, and one-time rental
35 payments to prevent eviction.

1 7. If the department has data indicating that a geographic
 2 area has a substantial number of persons with mental illness
 3 who are homeless and are not being served by an existing
 4 grantee for that area under the formula grant and the existing
 5 grantee has expressed a desire to no longer provide services
 6 or the grantee's contract was terminated by the department for
 7 nonperformance, the department shall issue a request for
 8 proposals to replace the grantee. Otherwise, the department
 9 shall maximize available funding by continuing to contract to
 10 the extent possible with those persons who are grantees as of
 11 the effective date of this subsection. The department shall
 12 issue a request for proposals if additional funding becomes
 13 available for expansion to persons who are not being served
 14 and it is not possible to utilize existing grantees.

15 Sec. 15. CHILD CARE AND DEVELOPMENT APPROPRIATION. There
 16 is appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the
 17 department of human services for the federal fiscal year
 18 beginning October 1, 2001, and ending September 30, 2002, the
 19 following amount:

20 \$ 39,478,642

21 Funds appropriated in this section are the funds
 22 anticipated to be received from the federal government under
 23 42 U.S.C., chapter 105, subchapter II-B, which provides for
 24 the child care and development block grant. The department
 25 shall expend the funds appropriated in this section as
 26 provided in the federal law making the funds available and in
 27 conformance with chapter 17A.

28 Sec. 16. PROCEDURE FOR REDUCED FEDERAL FUNDS.

29 1. If the funds received from the federal government for
 30 the block grants specified in this Act are less than the
 31 amounts appropriated, the funds actually received shall be
 32 prorated by the governor for the various programs, other than
 33 for the services to victims of sex offenses and for rape
 34 prevention education under section 4, subsection 2, of this
 35 Act, for which each block grant is available according to the

1 percentages that each program is to receive as specified in
2 this Act. However, if the governor determines that the funds
3 allocated by the percentages will not be sufficient to effect
4 the purposes of a particular program, or if the appropriation
5 is not allocated by percentage, the governor may allocate the
6 funds in a manner which will effect to the greatest extent
7 possible the purposes of the various programs for which the
8 block grants are available.

9 2. Before the governor implements the actions provided for
10 in subsection 1, the following procedures shall be taken:

11 a. The chairpersons and ranking members of the senate and
12 house standing committees on appropriations, the appropriate
13 chairpersons and ranking members of subcommittees of those
14 committees, the director of the legislative service bureau,
15 and the director of the legislative fiscal bureau shall be
16 notified of the proposed action.

17 b. The notice shall include the proposed allocations, and
18 information on the reasons why particular percentages or
19 amounts of funds are allocated to the individual programs, the
20 departments and programs affected, and other information
21 deemed useful. Chairpersons notified shall be allowed at
22 least two weeks to review and comment on the proposed action
23 before the action is taken.

24 3. If the amount of moneys received from the federal
25 government for a specific grant number specified in this Act
26 is less than the amount appropriated, the amount appropriated
27 shall be reduced accordingly. An annual report listing any
28 such appropriation reduction shall be submitted to the fiscal
29 committee of the legislative council.

30 Sec. 17. PROCEDURE FOR INCREASED FEDERAL FUNDS.

31 1. If funds received from the federal government in the
32 form of block grants exceed the amounts appropriated in
33 sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7, 10, and 12 of this Act, the excess
34 shall be prorated to the appropriate programs according to the
35 percentages specified in those sections, except additional

1 funds shall not be prorated for administrative expenses.

2 2. If actual funds received from the federal government
3 from block grants exceed the amount appropriated in section 11
4 of this Act for the low-income home energy assistance program,
5 not more than 15 percent of the excess may be allocated to the
6 low-income residential weatherization program.

7 3. If funds received from the federal government from
8 community services block grants exceed the amount appropriated

19 APPROPRIATIONS.

20 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section
21 8.41 to the Iowa department of public health for the federal
22 fiscal year beginning October 1, 2001, and ending September
23 30, 2002, the following amount:

25 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds
26 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
27 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 6A,

21 Sec. 13. SOCIAL SERVICES BLOCK GRANT PLAN. The department
22 of human services during each state fiscal year shall develop
23 a plan for the use of federal social services block grant
24 funds for the subsequent state fiscal year.

25 The proposed plan shall include all programs and services
26 at the state level which the department proposes to fund with
27 federal social services block grant funds, and shall identify
28 state and other funds which the department proposes to use to
29 fund the state programs and services.

30 The proposed plan shall also include all local programs and
31 services which are eligible to be funded with federal social
32 services block grant funds, the total amount of federal social
33 services block grant funds available for the local programs
34 and services, and the manner of distribution of the federal

34 for the services to victims of sex offenses and for rape

APPROPRIATING FEDERAL FUNDS MADE AVAILABLE FROM FEDERAL BLOCK GRANTS AND OTHER FEDERAL GRANTS, ALLOCATING PORTIONS OF FEDERAL BLOCK GRANTS, AND PROVIDING PROCEDURES IF FEDERAL FUNDS ARE MORE OR LESS THAN ANTICIPATED OR IF FEDERAL BLOCK GRANTS ARE MORE OR LESS THAN ANTICIPATED.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. SUBSTANCE ABUSE APPROPRIATION.

1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the Iowa department of public health for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 2001, and ending September 30, 2002, the following amount:

..... \$ 12,698,390

a. Funds appropriated in this subsection are the anticipated funds to be received from the federal government for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 6A, subchapter XVII, which provides for the substance abuse prevention and treatment block grant. The department shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

b. Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount not exceeding 5 percent shall be used by the department for administrative expenses.

c. The department shall expend no less than an amount equal to the amount expended for treatment services in the state fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, for pregnant women and women with dependent children.

d. Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount not exceeding \$24,585 shall be used for audits.

2. The funds remaining from the appropriation made in subsection 1 shall be allocated as follows:

a. At least 20 percent of the allocation shall be for prevention programs.

b. At least 35 percent of the allocation shall be spent on drug treatment and prevention activities.

c. At least 35 percent of the allocation shall be spent on alcohol treatment and prevention activities.

The auditor of state shall bill the division of mental health and developmental disabilities for the costs of the audits.

Sec. 3. MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH SERVICES APPROPRIATIONS.

1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the Iowa department of public health for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 2001, and ending September 30, 2002, the following amount:

The funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds anticipated to be received from the federal government for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 7, subchapter V, which provides for the maternal and child health services block grant. The department shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount not exceeding \$45,700 shall be used for audits.

From the funds set aside for administrative expenses by this subsection, the department of economic development shall pay to the auditor of state an amount sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use and administration of the state's portion of the funds appropriated in subsection 1. The auditor of state shall bill the department for the costs of the audit.

Sec. 11. LOW-INCOME HOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE APPROPRIATIONS.

1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the division of community action agencies of the department of human rights for the federal fiscal year

beginning October 1, 2001, and ending September 30, 2002, the following amount:

The funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds anticipated to be received from the federal government for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 94, subchapter II, which provides for the low-income home energy assistance block grants. The division of community action agencies of the department of human rights shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

2. Up to 15 percent of the amount appropriated in this section that is actually received shall be used for residential weatherization or other related home repairs for low-income households. Of this allocation amount, not more than 10 percent may be used for administrative expenses. In order to receive low-income home energy assistance program funding, the head of an eligible household must be willing to allow residential weatherization or other related home repairs. However, if the eligible household is located in rental property, the unwillingness of the property owner to allow residential weatherization or other related home repairs shall not prevent the eligible household from receiving low-income home energy assistance program funding.

3. After subtracting the allocation in subsection 2, up to \$2,663,921 is allocated for administrative expenses of the low-income home energy assistance program of which \$290,000 is allocated for administrative expenses of the division. The costs of auditing the use and administration of the portion of the appropriation in this section that is retained by the state shall be paid from the amount allocated in this subsection to the division. The auditor of state shall bill the division for the audit costs.

4. The remainder of the appropriation in this section following the allocations made in subsections 2 and 3, shall be used to help eligible households as defined in 42 U.S.C., chapter 94, subchapter II, to meet home energy costs.

5. Not more than 10 percent of the amount appropriated in this section that is actually received, may be carried forward for use in the succeeding federal fiscal year.

6. Expenditures for assessment and resolution of energy problems shall be limited to 5 percent of the amount appropriated in this section that is actually received.

Sec. 12. SOCIAL SERVICES APPROPRIATIONS.

1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the department of human services for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 2001, and ending September 30, 2002, the following amount:

Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds anticipated to be received from the federal government for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 7, subchapter XX, which provides for the social services block grant. The department of human services shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

2. Not more than \$1,178,341 of the funds appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the department of human services for general administration. From the funds set aside in this subsection for general administration, the department of human services shall pay to the auditor of state an amount sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use and administration of the state's portion of the funds appropriated in subsection 1.

Sec. 13. SOCIAL SERVICES BLOCK GRANT PLAN. The department of human services during each state fiscal year shall develop a plan for the use of federal social services block grant funds for the subsequent state fiscal year.

The proposed plan shall include all programs and services at the state level which the department proposes to fund with federal social services block grant funds, and shall identify state and other funds which the department proposes to use to fund the state programs and services.

The proposed plan shall also include all local programs and services which are eligible to be funded with federal social services block grant funds, the total amount of federal social services block grant funds available for the local programs and services, and the manner of distribution of the federal social services block grant funds to the counties. The proposed plan shall identify state and local funds which will be used to fund the local programs and services.

The proposed plan shall be submitted with the department's budget requests to the governor and the general assembly.

Sec. 14. PROJECTS FOR ASSISTANCE IN TRANSITION FROM HOMELESSNESS. Upon receipt of the minimum formula grant from the federal alcohol, drug abuse, and mental health administration to provide mental health services for the homeless, for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 2001, and ending September 30, 2002, the division of mental health and developmental disabilities of the department of human services shall assure that a project which receives funds under the formula grant from either the federal or local match share of 25 percent in order to provide outreach services to persons who are chronically mentally ill and homeless or who are subject to a significant probability of becoming homeless shall do all of the following:

1. Provide community mental health services, diagnostic services, crisis intervention services, and habilitation and rehabilitation services.
2. Refer clients to medical facilities for necessary hospital services, and to entities that provide primary health services and substance abuse services.
3. Provide appropriate training to persons who provide services to persons targeted by the grant.
4. Provide case management to homeless persons.
5. Provide supportive and supervisory services to certain homeless persons living in residential settings which are not otherwise supported.
6. Projects may expend funds for housing services including minor renovation, expansion and repair of housing, security deposits, planning of housing, technical assistance in applying for housing, improving the coordination of housing services, the costs associated with matching eligible homeless individuals with appropriate housing, and one-time rental payments to prevent eviction.

7. If the department has data indicating that a geographic area has a substantial number of persons with mental illness who are homeless and are not being served by an existing grantee for that area under the formula grant and the existing grantee has expressed a desire to no longer provide services or the grantee's contract was terminated by the department for nonperformance, the department shall issue a request for proposals to replace the grantee. Otherwise, the department shall maximize available funding by continuing to contract to the extent possible with those persons who are grantees as of the effective date of this subsection. The department shall issue a request for proposals if additional funding becomes available for expansion to persons who are not being served and it is not possible to utilize existing grantees.

Sec. 15. CHILD CARE AND DEVELOPMENT APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the department of human services for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 2001, and ending September 30, 2002, the following amount:

Funds appropriated in this section are the funds anticipated to be received from the federal government under 42 U.S.C., chapter 105, subchapter II-B, which provides for the child care and development block grant. The department shall expend the funds appropriated in this section as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

Sec. 16. PROCEDURE FOR REDUCED FEDERAL FUNDS.

1. If the funds received from the federal government for the block grants specified in this Act are less than the amounts appropriated, the funds actually received shall be prorated by the governor for the various programs, other than for the services to victims of sex offenses and for rape prevention education under section 4, subsection 2, of this

Act, for which each block grant is available according to the percentages that each program is to receive as specified in this Act. However, if the governor determines that the funds allocated by the percentages will not be sufficient to effect the purposes of a particular program, or if the appropriation is not allocated by percentage, the governor may allocate the funds in a manner which will effect to the greatest extent possible the purposes of the various programs for which the block grants are available.

2. Before the governor implements the actions provided for in subsection 1, the following procedures shall be taken:

a. The chairpersons and ranking members of the senate and house standing committees on appropriations, the appropriate chairpersons and ranking members of subcommittees of those committees, the director of the legislative service bureau, and the director of the legislative fiscal bureau shall be notified of the proposed action.

b. The notice shall include the proposed allocations, and information on the reasons why particular percentages or amounts of funds are allocated to the individual programs, the departments and programs affected, and other information deemed useful. Chairpersons notified shall be allowed at least two weeks to review and comment on the proposed action before the action is taken.

3. If the amount of moneys received from the federal government for a specific grant number specified in this Act is less than the amount appropriated, the amount appropriated shall be reduced accordingly. An annual report listing any such appropriation reduction shall be submitted to the fiscal committee of the legislative council.

Sec. 17. PROCEDURE FOR INCREASED FEDERAL FUNDS.

1. If funds received from the federal government in the form of block grants exceed the amounts appropriated in sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7, 10, and 12 of this Act, the excess

shall be prorated to the appropriate programs according to the percentages specified in those sections, except additional funds shall not be prorated for administrative expenses.

2. If actual funds received from the federal government from block grants exceed the amount appropriated in section 11 of this Act for the low-income home energy assistance program, not more than 15 percent of the excess may be allocated to the low-income residential weatherization program and not more than 5 percent of the excess may be used for administrative costs.

3. If funds received from the federal government from community services block grants exceed the amount appropriated in section 9 of this Act, 100 percent of the excess is allocated to the community services block grant program.

4. If the amount of moneys received from the federal government for a specific grant number specified in this Act exceeds the amount appropriated, the excess amount is appropriated for the purpose designated in the specific grant's appropriation. An annual report listing any such excess appropriations shall be submitted to the fiscal committee of the legislative council.

Sec. 18. PROCEDURE FOR EXPENDITURE OF ADDITIONAL FEDERAL FUNDS.
