**A BILL FOR**

1 An Act relating to relocation of the child support recovery unit  
2 to the department of revenue.  
3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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HF 54

1 Section 1. CHILD SUPPORT RECOVERY UNIT -- RELOCATION. It  
2 is the intent of the general assembly that the child support  
3 recovery unit be relocated within the department of revenue  
4 beginning July 1, 2006. The department of human services and  
5 the department of revenue shall develop a plan for the  
6 relocation and shall submit the plan to the general assembly  
7 and the governor no later than December 1, 2005. The plan  
8 shall include but is not limited to all of the following:

9 1. A description of the restructuring of the department of  
10 revenue necessary to assume the duties of the child support  
11 recovery unit.

12 2. A budget request, including the number of full-time  
13 equivalent positions to be relocated, to cover the expenses of  
14 the relocated child support recovery unit.

15 3. A listing of any changes in state law and rules, and  
16 any federal limitations or requirements applicable to and any  
17 federal approval necessary to allow for the relocation of the  
18 child support recovery unit.

19 EXPLANATION

20 This bill directs the department of human services and the  
21 department of revenue to develop a plan for the relocation of  
22 the child support recovery unit within the department of  
23 revenue. The bill specifies that it is the intent of the  
24 general assembly that the relocation take place by July 1,  
25 2006. The departments are to submit the plan to the general  
26 assembly and to the governor by December 1, 2005. The plan is  
27 to include a description of the restructuring of the  
28 department of revenue necessary to assume the duties of the  
29 child support recovery unit, a budget request to cover the  
30 expenses of the relocation, and a listing of any changes in  
31 state law and rules, any federal limitations or requirements  
32 applicable to the relocation, and any federal approval  
33 necessary to the relocation.

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
