AN ACT

DIRECTING THE STATE BOARD OF REGENTS TO CONDUCT A STUDY OF THE ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS COMMON TO THE STATE UNIVERSITIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:
