

HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 103

A Resolution requesting that the United States Postal Service retain the area mail processing center in Sioux City, Iowa.

WHEREAS, the current area mail processing center in Sioux City, Iowa, serves the fourth largest city in Iowa and employs 150 people; and

WHEREAS, the United States Postal Service has announced a study examining the feasibility of centralizing Sioux City's mail processing in Sioux Falls, South Dakota; and

WHEREAS, currently the mail service in Sioux City and the surrounding area is very prompt, providing one-day service locally and national service in two days; and

WHEREAS, the people of the Siouxland area are justifiably proud of their 150-year-old postmark; and

WHEREAS, loss of the Sioux City area mail processing center would degrade service to two days for the Siouxland area and to three days for other parts of the country; NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, That the House of Representatives requests that the United States Postal Service retain the area mail processing center in Sioux City, Iowa; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be sent to the Postmaster General and the Chief Executive Officer of the United States Postal Service, to the Hawkeye District Manager of the United
