7 This bill authorizes persons involved in court or
8 administrative agency proceedings involving unemployment
9 compensation claims access to dependent adult abuse
10 information, other than unfounded dependent adult abuse
11 information, maintained by the department of human services.

RE: LSB # 1203 - An Act relating to access to dependent adult abuse information and unemployment compensation claims.

This bill with one section authorizes persons involved in court or administrative agency proceedings, before Workforce Development and the Department of Inspections and Appeals, involving unemployment insurance benefit cases access to dependent adult abuse information maintained by the Department of Human Services for the purpose of determining an individual's eligibility for unemployment benefits. The bill does not authorize access to unfounded dependent adult abuse information.

The problem is a question has arisen as to whether the administrative agencies may have access to dependent adult abuse information because the agencies are not included in the list of agencies granted access. The information is necessary to determine if the actions of a claimant for unemployment benefits would result in an allowance or disqualification from the receipt of benefits.

Workforce Development hears about 28 cases a year currently in which dependent adult abuse information is pertinent.

The solution is to amend the Code to include access to the information for unemployment benefit cases.

Section 1. Section 235B.6, subsection 2, paragraph d, Code 2005, is amended by adding the following new subparagraph:

NEW SUBPARAGRAPH. (4) A court or administrative agency making a determination regarding an unemployment compensation claim pursuant to section 96.6.
