1 Section 1. Section 91D.1, subsection 1, paragraph a, Code  
2 2005, is amended to read as follows:

3 a. The hourly wage stated in the federal minimum wage law,  
4 pursuant to 29 U.S.C. § 206, shall be increased to ~~\$3.85-on~~  
5 ~~January-1-of-1990,-\$4.25-on-January-1-of-1991,-and-\$4.65~~ \$6.15  
6 on January 1 ~~of-1992,~~ 2007.

7 EXPLANATION

8 This bill raises the state's hourly minimum wage to \$6.15  
9 beginning January 1, 2007.

10 The federal minimum wage laws have primacy over state  
11 minimum wage laws unless the state sets a higher minimum wage.  
12 The federal hourly minimum wage, which took effect September  
13 1, 1997, is \$5.15. The federal subminimum, or youth, wage for  
14 employees under 20 years of age during their first 90  
15 consecutive calendar days of employment with an employer is  
16 \$4.25 an hour.
