SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A Joint Resolution authorizing the temporary use and consumption
2 of wine in the State Capitol in conjunction with the awards
3 ceremony of the World Food Prize Foundation.

4 WHEREAS, the State of Iowa has the honor of being the home of
5 the World Food Prize Foundation which annually presents an
6 international award recognizing outstanding individual
7 achievement in improving the quality, quantity, or availability
8 of food in the world; and

9 WHEREAS, Iowa's unique State Capitol is an optimal location
10 for this awards ceremony of the World Food Prize Foundation and
11 previously served as the ceremony location; and

12 WHEREAS, wine is customarily served as an accompaniment to the
13 food and entertainment provided at this type of awards ceremony
14 and wine was served when the ceremony was previously held at the
15 State Capitol; and

16 WHEREAS, under 11 IAC 100.4(8), which prohibits the
17 consumption of alcoholic beverages on the capitol complex, it is
18 not possible to serve wine at this type of awards ceremony in the
19 State Capitol; NOW THEREFORE,

SJR 2001

1 Section 1. Notwithstanding 11 IAC 100.4(8) and any
2 contrary provisions of chapter 123, prohibiting the use and
3 consumption of alcoholic beverages in public places, wine may
4 be used and consumed within the state capitol at an awards
5 ceremony, to be held on or around October 19, 2006, hosted and
6 organized in whole or in part by the world food prize
7 foundation if the person providing the food and wine at the
8 awards ceremony possesses an appropriate valid liquor control
9 license. For the purpose of this section and section 123.95,
10 the state capitol is a private place.

11 EXPLANATION

12 This joint resolution authorizes the world food prize
13 foundation to use and consume wine at an awards ceremony to be
14 held at the state capitol on or around October 19, 2006.
15 Current law and rules prohibit the use and consumption of
16 alcoholic beverages within the state capitol.

WHEREAS, the State of Iowa has the honor of being the home
of the World Food Prize Foundation which annually presents an
international award recognizing outstanding individual
achievement in improving the quality, quantity, or
availability of food in the world; and

WHEREAS, Iowa's unique State Capitol is an optimal location
for this awards ceremony of the World Food Prize Foundation
and previously served as the ceremony location; and

WHEREAS, wine is customarily served as an accompaniment to
the food and entertainment provided at this type of awards
ceremony and wine was served when the ceremony was previously
held at the State Capitol; and

WHEREAS, under 11 IAC 100.4(8), which prohibits the
consumption of alcoholic beverages on the capitol complex, it
is not possible to serve wine at this type of awards ceremony
in the State Capitol; NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Notwithstanding 11 IAC 100.4(8) and any
contrary provisions of chapter 123, prohibiting the use and
consumption of alcoholic beverages in public places, wine may
